<u>MEMORIAL DAY FUN FLY, MAY 24-26</u> Saturday and Sunday will be our Memorial Day Fun Fly. Steve Statkus is arranging special events including a contest designed to enable all skill levels to participate and have fun. The grills will be

including a contest designed to enable all skill levels to participate and have fun. The grills will be fired up – we may even enjoy the results of a grillmaster contest. Show your skill in a spot landing contest. Come for the weekend and enjoy our campground. Roast marshmallows over the bonfire. Relax with your fish pole around our well-stocked pond.

The contest will probably use the "Inner Course" turn points for the 23/1 guys, (the 2-33's and 1-26's) and use cell phone photos to document reaching the turn points. The timer starts at takeoff and stops at landing. Each turn point will be worth 50 points (adjusted for experience handicap); additional points will be based on calculated average speed. Each pilot will take a 3K tow and release over the center of the glider club, then head for the turn point of his choice. Go any direction to start, but complete a full circuit before repeating a turn point. Points will be deducted if time exceeds 1 hour. Enter as many times as you want. Best OLC score for higher performance ships. Maybe not real cross country racing but it will be a fun fly. Winners of the event (highest score based on turn points made plus highest average speed) will get their flight card torn up, plus bragging rights. The spot landing contest will be a dollar per chance, winner gets the pot.

SUNDAY THE SOARING WEATHER WAS SUPERB- 5/18

Early Sunday morning XC Skies agreed with Blipmaps and gave an unbelievable forecast considering the spring flying we have had. Predictions were for 6 to 8 knot thermals to 8,000 feet with light winds at altitude. Amazing as it is, the forecasts were absolutely correct. Although areas of the field were still damp, the calm winds allowed operation from the west end on the driest portion of the runway. With all flights enjoying abundant lift, the field dried out even more before anyone returned for a landing. As the day progressed great looking clouds were in all directions and practically every cloud had lift. There were a couple of reports of ten knots on the vario averager!

On Line Contest (OLC) shows 4,200 km flown by the 11 CCSC pilots who reported their flights. The soaring conditions held up very late into the day as evidenced by Chuck Lohre landing at about 7:20 pm.

PENNSYLVANIA TO FLORIDA DOWNWIND DASH – DAN REGAN



As has been reported in the past, John Lubon and I have been planning a central Pennsylvania to Florida trip for this spring.

As of May 20 it does not look promising that Mother Nature will give us the good cold front which is needed for this downwind dash attempt. This whole spring the fronts don't seem to get organized and they just break up before producing conditions that make an attempt feasible. As you have seen at Caesar Creek, until this Sunday the conditions have not been great.

Karl Striedieck, who flew from central Pennsylvania back in the late 1990s and got to within 100 miles of Florida, announced a

few weeks ago that he would make an attempt the next day in his Duo Discus. He made it only to Altoona which was about 20 miles into the 850 miles attempted!

There was one day a couple of weeks ago that had some possibilities. The problem was, John had promised Mr. Proctor and Mr. Gamble that he would be working in Canada that day, so he was not available. My story is that I had great aspirations for the day and took off shortly after daylight. The ridge winds were predicted to be just right. I just knew I had a 1000K distance in the bag. It would be a piece of cake. Well, the way I remember it is that I took off shortly after 7:00 am and was sitting in a farmer's field shortly after 8:00 am. Another pilot took off about 45 minutes after me (while I was searching for a suitable field) with the intent to fly 1000 <u>MILES</u> in a PIK-20. His flight got only 300 miles south of Ridge Soaring. The day developed with great wave clouds and, as Tom Knauff told me about 11:00 when I returned from my retrieve, "This is the type of wave day we live for".

The sport of soaring has a way of making a pilot really humble just as soon as someone thinks a "sure thing" comes along. So the conclusion is that the spring of 2014 window of opportunity for this long flight is closing, but we will keep watching the weather just in case Mother Nature gives us a shot at it.
