

Ross Bales Private Pilot Phase Check - Ross was a busy guy, showing tremendous leadership acting as a mentor with newer campers. He made great use of his time at camp, successfully completing a phase check with examiner Dick Eckels, in preparation for his Private-Glider check ride. I hope CCSC will be seeing a new private pilot soon and perhaps Ross will follow his grandfather's footsteps and become a flight instructor. Good luck Ross! Jack Runyon's Solo - Perhaps the most vivid memory of every pilot is the day he first flys solo. Most of us are filled with emotions: excitement, trepidation and pride from the recognition and whole new stature on return to earth. You also have to follow all the traditions around "soloing", including drenching the student with water (in Jacks case a couple of times with the bucket and a trip to the pond). The back of Jacks solo shirt was cutoff and is currently on display in the Club house.

The traditional removal of a new pilot's shirt tail is a sign of the instructor's new confidence in his student after successful completion of the 1st solo flight. In the days of tandem trainers, the student sat in the front seat, with the instructor behind. As there were often no radios, the instructor would tug on the student pilot's shirttail to get his attention. A successful first solo flight is an indication that the student can fly without the instructor



Kevin Wolf's return to Youth Camp was with a mission; "...to video camp and capture the excitement of the campers that I felt when I attended camp". Kevin attended Youth Camp from 2008-2010 and will be a senior at Chapman University this fall with a double major in both Film and also Business. He spent the week placing GoPro camera's in every conceivable location on the gliders, tow planes and even used a Quad-copter to capture video. Kevin's work included flights with Brian Stoops to capture some inflight action. Kevin will produce a promotional video on CCSC that includes Youth Camp activities that he plans to submit as his senior project at Chapman. The preliminary results shown at the closing meeting of 2014 Youth Camp were spectacular; I can't wait to see the final product.
