BERNIE FULLENKAMP INVESTIGATES SOARING IN GERMANY

Bernie & Durelle Fullenkamp had the privilege to spend a few weeks in Germany to visit with some dear Air Force friends who have retired and are living in Germany. Although the trip was not focused on soaring flight, (which would have been Bernie's preference), Bernie did get to do a few things related to glider flight. Dieter and Henry had both recommended that a visit to the Wasserkuppe Glider Museum was well worth the effort and Bernie would agree!

While returning from an overnight stay in Rothenburg their driving route took them past the DG sailplane factory. The factory tour was superb, however, as is the case for nearly every glider Bernie attempts to get in -- the fit was tight!

Both Henry and Dieter had shared with Bernie that local glider clubs were abundant and sure enough Bernie found LSV Essweiler Soaring Club only 15 min north of Neunkirchen am Potzberg (the small village in which their friends live). Bernie spent the day at the Essweiler club and was welcomed as if he were a regular club member (it probably helped that Bernie showed up early and acted like he was part of the crew). In addition to the reward of hanging out with fellow glider pilots Bernie enjoyed a motor glider flight with 80 yr old Luntz in which they climbed to cloud base ~1000 meters and then turned off the motor and enjoyed the next 45 min prior to a pure glider return to the field. The highlight of the day was Bernie's first winch launch in a Grob Twin

Astir. The winch launch put the aircraft at ~300 meters and then a combination of ridge/thermal activity enabled a climb to ~1000 meters and an hour long flight before the PIC needed to return to his primary crew duty as the winch operator. Johan, the 19 yr old PIC had grown up in the shadow of the club, had his first flight at age 4, soloed at 14, and is an "old hand" at 19!!! As with any good flying club, the day ended with beer and flight stories. Bernie is definitely looking forward to a Germany trip focused on soaring flight!!

Mike Hutchinson started his soaring career by joining the Central Indiana Soaring Society in 1976. He was very active in that club, serving over the years in nearly all the roles that enable a club to thrive: Chief Tow Pilot, Chief of Maintenance, Treasurer, Member of the Board of Directors, President and Project Manager for the refurbishment/repair of three 1-26s and two 2-33s. He even found time to fly, earning a Gold badge with diamonds. In 1990 at Seguatchie Soaring in Tennessee he completed multiple 500K and 600K flights. He also competed in "standard class" local, regional and national contests. In addition to flying various club aircraft, Mike built a BJ-1B Duster glider and has owned a STD Jantar, Discus and ASW20. Mike joined CCSC in 2006. By that time he had over 3000 hours of power and glider time combined, including serving as a contest tow pilot. Although he just wanted to fly his glider, he was
