

## LOG SPLITTER NEEDED

If anyone is willing to loan his splitter to the club for one day, it would be appreciated. We have a great deal of wood cut up and ready to split to keep the clubhouse warm this winter. Also, one additional person is needed to help with the splitting work. Bob Miller is preparing for the forthcoming Cub Scout camp-out and (the parent's) offer to perform a service project. He hopes to ask them to move the split wood and to stack it for us. So, the splitter is needed on or before August 23. ## ASTRONOMY AT CCSC

He has a reputation as a very interesting speaker, so you will not want to miss this. There is a potential for it being a great evening for star gazing since there will be minimal moonlight, so bring your telescope.

## **NEW RADIOS FOR GROUND CREWS**

We now have six (6) new fully operational walkie-talkies. They have a range of 23 miles, so we should be able to reach anyone on the field, we just need to use them. They are now located on the south side of the hanger, in the cubby hole on the work bench. They have been programmed and the system is "locked" to prevent inadvertent channel changing or system setup. You just have to turn them on. Brian Stoops will be around to show you some other features on the radio. OH... They all have belt clips that can be hung on a belt or pocket, and there are also an ear piece with microphone attached for those a little hard of hearing.

## **CLEANING EQUIPMENT FOR REMOVING BUGS FROM GLIDERS**

Brian Stoops purchased two 5 gallon Green "Menards" buckets, with nylon mesh sponges, towels and a bottle of lemon dishwashing soap. They are also located on the south side of the hangar in the cubby hole. Let's try (hard) to wash the leading edges down at the end of day on the K21's and Grobs. Just put about 2 gallons of water in the buckets from the tap in the veranda. Then put about 8 to 10 drops of soap in to form light suds. One person can scrub and the another person can walk behind and dry. It does not get much easier than that.

## AIR SHOWS AUGUST 30 AND SEPTEMBER 6-7

CCSC will be represented at three air shows coming up: Red Stewart Airfield (Cubby's) in Waynesville on Saturday, August 30, Wright Brothers Aero Carnival on Saturday, September 6, at Huffman Prairie and Lunken Airport Airshow both Saturday and Sunday, September 6-7. <u>Bob Miller</u>, <u>Brian Stoops</u> and <u>Gary Adams</u> are coordinating CCSC participation at the three fields, respectively. Brian is preparing new brochures. There will be a raffle at each airshow for a free glider ride which will provide us with contact information for prospective new members. ## PAYPAL AVAILABLE FOR PAYING CCSC BILLS

The flexibility of paying monthly charges using PayPal has been available to members for several months and is being used by many. The process is really quite simple. After you review your monthly statement, log on to the the club website, http://soar-ccsc.com/, and navigate to the "Members Only"

page. To access the "Members Only" page you will need to enter the password that is printed at the bottom of your monthly statement. You then should select "Pay Your Bill Here". When that page is displayed, enter your account number, then click on the "Pay Now" button. Enter the amount you desire to pay in the box under Buy Now/Item Price. Click "Update" and verify that the correct amount is shown. Next you choose a way to pay. If you already have set up a PayPal account, choose that option and all your information will become available for an easy finish. Most likely you are reading this only if you do not already have a PayPal account, so you will need to click on "Don't have a PayPal account", then enter all the information and click "continue". To charge this transaction to your credit card, click on the "Credit Card" option and then enter your credit card information. Then click "Review and Continue". Your information will be shown for your review and verification. If everything is correct, click the "Pay Now" button. A confirmation page will then be presented so you can be confident that the process was successful. If you choose to use this procedure regularly you will probably choose to set up a PayPal account to streamline the process and avoid entering all your information each time. If you choose you can have the money transferred directly from your bank account instead of via your credit card. By the way, this service is not free. CCSC pays a fee of about 3% of each transaction, so there is a small advantage to the club if we all pay by check. However, in the few months that it has been available this service has been used by many members. It is really helpful to avoid late charges. It really is convenient if you like this approach to managing your finances.

By the way, the club is also set up to process payments at the flight line using a similar PayPal process. There is even a credit card reader available to crew chiefs and instructions for processing the payments are in the crew chief manual. We should never lose a guest ride in the future for lack of cash or check to make the payment.
