# **FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS FOR 2014**

Full year net income was \$2,366 favorable to plan on gross income of \$175,358. One important contributer to this favorable variance was that flights for the year totaled 1835, whereas the budget was based on an estimate of only 1700 flights. The fuel index is anticipated to decrease based on the fuel delivery 1/3/2015 from the new supplier at the current lower price. Overall, the financial situation is still looking good. There is ample cash on hand to cover the anticipated expenses during the next three months.

#### THOMAS P. BALES

Tom Bales died on Saturday, Dec. 27, following an extended illness. He was one of the members of SSD who made the bold move to purchase the farm that we now enjoy as the CCSC gliderport. He served superbly as Chief Instructor and later as Designated Flight Examiner. His *Tom's Tips for Flying the 2-33* served as the primary reference for students for many years. Tom was also a tow pilot, logging over 11,000 tow flights. With his wife, Donna, Tom operated a soaring school at Myrtle Beach for many years. After returning to Ohio he was nearly always at the club on Wednesdays, either to instruct or tow, or do any of the other tasks required to keep the club running.

Tom displayed an exuberant enthusiasm for many things, but two of his greatest joys in life were soaring and his grandchildren. He was especially proud that his grandson, Ross Bales, had the opportunity to learn to soar at CCSC. Tom enjoyed helping at Youth Camp, accordingly the family would appreciate any donations in Tom's memory be made to the Caesar Creek Youth Soaring Association (CCYSA). ### THOMAS P BALES: A COUPLE OF JIM PRICE'S MEMORIES

On my training flight number 26 Joe Jackson (in the back seat) pulled the release. I was surprised, but managed an acceptable turn back to the field and a decent landing (with my heart pounding). As I remember, on the next flight I went with Tom Bales. I was feeling pretty good, having just completed my first simulated rope break. At about 200 feet I heard a loud bang. Oh no, another "rope break"! When I looked ahead the tow plane was still in position and the rope was still attached. Tom said, "I just opened the back window so you could hear the sound it makes. Notice that the glider is flying just fine. If the back window isn't latched properly it might come open and surprise you".

On another flight with Tom cu's were just starting to form. We were directly over the field at maybe 1200 feet when Tom said, "See that little cu forming to the north? Let me have the controls, let's go see if we can catch a thermal." I was apprehensive when Tom flew to the north, away from the field. At about 800 feet above ground he said. "Well, no luck. Your glider." I didn't know what to do. Tom calmly said, "Let's just start the downwind leg from here and we'll make a right turn onto base leg." Like a lot of beginners I was fixated on getting back across the field to make a "standard" pattern. That lesson broke me of it. Tom taught me many valuable lessons.

Tom was also a mentor for Ronnie when she was learning. He and I signed her off for solo in October, 1996.

There must be a thousand stories from the hundreds of pilots that Tom mentored over his many decades of teaching. He loved to instruct and it showed. Tom collaborated with his wife, Donna, to write a little book about their many years of running a commercial glider operation in Myrtle Beach. I don't think Donna will mind if I tell my favorite story from the book ....

About that time, Jim Iverson came into the office and Donna said, "Here's your pilot now. You can go whenever you like."

The girl replied, "Oh, I get a pilot?" She was under the impression that people flew the gliders themselves, and after having been told that everyone landed back at the airport and no one had ever been hurt, she was ready to go. She figured that if all those other people could do it, she could too.

# THOMAS P BALES: A COUPLE OF JOHN ANTRIM'S MEMORIES

With Tom's background in the Marines as a radar maintenance specialist and Staff Sargent for the Hellcat night fighters in the Pacific theater of WW2, one of the things he did after returning to civilian life was repair television sets. That technical acumen benefitted CCSC many times. Tom earned his Airframe Mechanic license and was particularly good at noticing problems with the gliders that others missed in preflight inspections. Who knows how many lives he saved by his thoroughness.

John also remembers Tom as a superb flight instructor. With experience as a school teacher and a passion for soaring, Tom was always teaching. He made flying really fun. He was cheerful, always joking. Tom's interests included investments in the stock market. John remembers flight reviews with Tom in the back seat of a 2-33 with a portable radio, listening to the stock market report while completing John's flight review.
