
SSD ANNUAL MEETING ADOPTS REVISED CODE OF REGULATIONS

The Annual Meeting of Soaring Society of Dayton was held on Wednesday, April 8. Eleven members were present and an additional 140 were represented by proxy. In all, 52% of the outstanding shares were voted, satisfying the criteria for a quorum and making the election and vote on the revisions to the Code of Regulations valid. John Atkins, John Lubon and Norb Maurer were reelected for 3-year terms as directors. The vote on the revisions to the Code of Regulations was overwhelmingly in favor of the changes. (The Code of Regulations is the document that defines SSD and describes how the organization functions; other organizations use the words Bylaws or Constitution for such a document.) This was a key step in the effort to improve club governance.

DIRECTORS HOLD FORMATIVE MEETING

On Saturday, April 11, the SSD Directors and CCSC Trustees met together to transition the responsibility of operation of the club to SSD and to agree on the formation of the new Board of Directors. At that time three Directors who have served the club tirelessly for many years submitted their resignations: Bob Root, Dieter Schmidt and Bill Maxwell. The club owes a great deal to these

individuals for the leadership and hard work they have given the club! The remaining directors appointed Bob Miller, Rolf Hegele and Jim Dudley to fill open positions. The revised Code of Reglations sets the number of Directors at eleven (11), an increase of two, each with a 3-year term. Those two positions remain unfilled, pending ongoing recruitment efforts, with the expectation that they will be filled at the next scheduled meeting of the board. After a comprehensive discussion about the many responsibilities and tasks involved in operating the club, the organizational structure shown in the accompanying chart was agreed upon, effective immediately.

IT WAS A GREAT WEEKEND FOR SOARING

Saturday the CCSC field was too wet and soft so Bob Root's 2nd Saturday Crew set up at Clinton County and launched a total of 14 flights. There would have been more, but nearly all flights were for the full hour and there were only two gliders. With light winds favoring runway 09 the CCSC field was useable by Sunday and it was another great day with private ships out for practice and several members completing field check flights. One tow plane was not sufficient to keep up with the desires of members to fly. There were 27 flights; with a second tow plane there would have been 37!

SUMMER SCHEDULE NOW IN EFFECT -BRIAN STOOPS

- 9:00 am Crews start preflighting and moving aircraft to flight line
- 10:00 am Begin flying Ideal time for training, currency, flight review, field check, etc.
- 12:30 pm Thermals start Ideal time for cross country departures
- 6:00 pm Start putting equipment away.

Note: if unable to participate for the full day, arrange for a sub and contact your Crew Chief.

PREFLIGHT PREPARATIONS - BRAIN STOOPS

- Check tire pressure before leaving hangar. The concrete floor makes the visual check easier and the compressor and air hose are at the hangar. Be especially vigilant about the front tires of the ASK-21 and Grob 103 because a flat front tire can result in loss of control.
- Place a walkie talkie in each retrieve vehicle and give one to the Crew Chief or Assistant. Please use them to facilitate traffic flow or emergency response.
- Fill all retrieve vehicles with gas and check oil at the beginning of the day. By the way, be sure that there are always at least 2 carts at the flight line for retrieving gliders or emergency use.
- Equip the Crew Chief with an aircraft frequency radio. They are another tool for safety.

EVERYONE MUST BECOME A MEMBER BEFORE FLIGHT TRAINING

It has been discovered that our insurance does not cover flight training for anyone who is not a member, even the spouse or the child of a Member. Although our Code of Regulations states that a spouse or a child of a Member may receive training without having to become a member until the initial solo flight, it appears that it will be necessary to change that policy. The Board passed a motion on Saturday that: "No person may receive flight instruction in club aircraft until that person has become a Member, Family Member or Youth Member of CCSC." It is important that no CFI make or sign any logbook entries for any non-member for any flight in a CCSC aircraft. Such training is not covered by our insurance. Furthermore, such activity would be viewed as a commercial activity and jeopardize our insurance status as a non-commercial operation.
