2015 CCSC ADULT CAMP AND VINTAGE GLIDER RALLEY - STEVE STATKUS

The week started out with thunderstorms on Monday. Although the Weather Goddess might have been suffering a hang over on Tuesday with low ceilings until mid afternoon and lift that was hard to find, the afternoon was just fine for training flights. Glorious soaring conditions brought out many members on Wednesday and Thursday. Friday it was beautifully clear but the buoyant air was hidden, 1-26s were floating down at 100 fpm, rather then the usual no-lift descent rate of 250 fpm.

By Friday evening 100 flights had been enjoyed, including one guest ride, one new member, two land outs and 23 vintage flights. Of the vintage flying 12 flights were by club members and 11 were made by visiting vintage gliders. The vintage glider task was duration plus turn points around the

inner course. We learned on Friday, that even without lift a well flown 1-26 released at 3K AGL just south of Stollies can make it around all three turn points (Stollies, Cubby's, the dam) and make it back to the field, but just barely.

JIM GOEBEL'S CHALLENGE: Read Chap. 13 (Human Factors) of the <u>Glider Flying Handbook</u>

I have not been flying with y'all at the gliderport recently. This has not been by choice or by chance. At present I can preach, but not teach. I have recently been assigned the duties of:

- 1. Being a Safety Committee Member for at least a year. Not just a member, but an ACTIVE member; participating in ALL Safety Committee activities;
- 2. Taking a leading role in improving the Safety Culture at CCSC;
- 3. Preparing a document defining/describing the "Ideal Safety Culture" for CCSC;
- 4. Providing "actionable steps" for the club to take toward a goal of having a Safety Culture;
- 5. Describing what a Safety Culture means to, and actions to be taken by: the Board of Directors, Crew Chiefs, Flight Instructors, Tow Pilots, Operations Personnel and General Membership.

So, if you see your role within CCSC in the list, please be receptive to changing CCSC's "Safety Culture" for the better. This requires that YOU (participate and...) change both your, and the club's "Safety Culture's" status quo; ...and that YOU actively seek, communicate and support Safety's evolution at CCSC.

The BIGGEST THREAT to Safety in flight operations is the "nut" that is attached to the controls, i.e. the pilot. There are many other threats to Safety and we will address a number of them in coming articles in an effort to reduce or eliminate those threats to safety. But this time let's focus on the pilot.

My first challenges to you are easy:

<u>Crack the books again;</u> specifically, re-read the newer (2012) Glider Flying Handbook (FAA-H-8083-13A *Glider Flying Handbook*). If you don't own one, get one; or read one available on the internet by visiting the FAA's or SSA's website. (<u>http://www.faa.gov/regul</u> <u>ations_policies/handboo</u> <u>ks_manuals/aircraft/glide</u> <u>r_handbook/</u>)

Observe and

<u>Communicate</u>. Look for opportunities to improve Safety at CCSC and for the greater soaring and other flying communities. Pass along your observations and

suggestions to me (<u>GOEBELJW at AOL.COM</u>) and to your fellow club members, pilots, crew chiefs and board members. Note: If your suggestion gets to me, it WILL BE DOCUMENTED AND ACTED UPON.

FLYING ACTIVITY

Saturday Maury Drummey's crew was busy with 11 Introductory Flights, several of which were Mile High. Members also showed up in force to enjoy the great soaring, so there was no lull in activity all day long. Sunday was a great day to fly, and the cross country team set out to help our OLC score. A total of 21 flights were reported to OLC by nine members during the past week, improving our standing to 7th place in the Silver League.

SAFETY OBSERVATION - DICK SCHEPER

While towing last weekend from a very congested flight line, I advised the glider pilot that I wanted to slow tug him forward into the clear area of our 45 degree 'zone of safety'. I thought about his cg hook, the times I've seen similar gliders vear off to one side due to slight crossword, or a wing held too low, or too slow accleration before rudder effectiveness, or the time one of our pilots crashed into a wind sock tower. As soon as we were in the clear, the wing walker gave me the go signal. I throttled up and the glider temporarily veared off to the side...away from the flight line this time, but...

So, be observant and think about possible accident scenarios when moving, positioning, launching, or recovering aircraft.
