RUNWAY DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS

Throughout the spring and summer the wet conditions have triggered numerous ideas and proposals which have been discussed and debated at Board meetings. At the August meeting the Board approved spending up to \$5,000 for runway drainage improvements. The plan is to treat the most troublesome portion of the runway by extending three existing drainage lines. Inspection of the existing system has revealed blockage of some outlets, so those are being cleaned out. The new lines are parallel with flight operations and should result in a minimum of interference with safe operation as settling takes place. Henry Meyerrose is overseeing the work.



This machine digs the trench and inserts the drain line, moving continuously a few inches each minute. The trench is then filled by a tractor leaving the excess soil piled directly over the trench so it can fill in as the disturbed material settles.



By midday Wednesday one new line had been completed and the second was nearing completion.


If y'all took up last week's challenge by reading (or re-reading) the Human Factors chapter in the Glider Flying Handbook, you may have gleaned that 80% of aviation accidents have only YOU (pilot, crew, clubmember) to blame. Our recent record at the club is NOT pretty. Four gliders have been destroyed beyond repair (SGS 1-34, two SGS 1-26s, and Blanik L-33); several gliders required extensive repairs (long landings into trees, flown through tree tops, hard landings, tail first landings, launches gone wrong, tails/canopies/wing trailing edges etc. damaged, hangar rash); and at least three towplane incidents required engine and airframe repairs (loss of control, gear failures).

If we don't start taking Safety seriously, we soon may (through costs or litigation) not have a flying club. Or a worse case, we might seriously injure or kill someone in a glider accident....perhaps YOU!

The National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB) publishes accident and some mishap investigation results...as well as recommendations. As a club, we've trended to conceal investigation results from general membership. If we learn of OUR mishaps, it is usually a result of a (thankfully) loose lipped, legacy member, and only if we happened to be present the day when their casual talk happened. In future, I may discuss a mishap or two. If you wish to learn more about some of our mishaps, ask a legacy member, perhaps a crew chief or two...or ask me. [GOEBELJW at AOL.COM]

These incidents are our MISHAPS, but what about the many, many NEAR MISHAPS we've managed to avert; or, by DIVINE INTERVENTION we've failed at becoming a Darwin Award recipient. Below is a chart produced by the SSA's Safety Foundation. My suggestion: Let's NOT be on future charts!
