SATURDAY JULY 2 – 1ST SATURDAY CREW

Steve Fenstermaker reported that although overcast skies prevented thermal development, he and his crew launched 19 flights, including two mile-high guest rides. Jim Goebel and Joe Jackson, who are not on this crew, helped out with instructional flights. Steve noted that the ground tow rope on the Kubota was too short and needed to be lengthened. Reminder: with a rope that is too short, a glider wing can strike the towing vehicle during an excursion from a straight-ahead tow.

TOWPLANES – STATUS REPORT FROM TIM CHRISTMAN

48L: Out-of-commission until we can afford an overhaul of the engine that was previously on 909 and was removed after metallic particles were found inside the oil filter on June 19.

33Z: In normal service.

909: The rebuilt engine that was previously on 48L was installed on 909 and the 10 hour break-in has been completed. The plan is to use 909 to tow lighter weight fiberglass gliders to a maximum altitude of 2,000 feet AGL for the remainder of the extended break-in period. Heavy two-place fiberglass gliders and gliders such as the 2-33s and 1-26s that require slower tow speeds will not be towed during this period.

ADULT CAMP & VINTAGE GLIDER RALLY – AUGUST 21-27

From Steve Statkus...

As usual, CCSC will be conducting daily flight operations, (this year during the fourth week of August) known as the Adult Camp. It's a low-key operation that provides student pilots an opportunity for multiple instructional flights that they may find difficult to accomplish during normal crew day flying. The difference between the Adult Camp and normal crew day flying is that there is no dedicated crew available during the Adult Camp, so we all share the crew duties. You'll be flying, but you'll also be crewing, so it's an immersion-like experience.

One feature available during the Adult Camp is a series of routes designed for 1-26 and 2-33 type gliders that we call the "Inner Course." There are actually several Inner Courses and the idea is to start the glider pilot thinking of going somewhere and not just flying around in circles in the same thermal. Each turn point is within 3 miles of the glider club, so outlandings do not happen when flying the Inner Course. Last year we were taking 3K tows to Stolle's Field (turnpoint 1) and completing the entire course with zero lift landing back at the field with a straight in approach from the spillway (turn point 3.) It's fun and you really get a feeling for the performance (or lack of performance) of your glider.

Concurrent with Adult Camp, we open our facility to outside pilots (SSA membership required) to come and join us for some mid-summer Southern Ohio soaring fun. Last year we invited vintage gliders but this year we've opened the week to all types as well as vintage gliders and are planning a contest of sorts. The contest will require a recording device such as an iPhone to record your flight and the transfer of that flight file to OLC. At the end of the day we'll pull up OLC and see each flight. I'm told that OLC handicaps, so we ought to be able to pick a winner for the day. Fly as many attempts as you want, pick the best, and log it. This daily contest will be open to all.

We'll also have dollar beer and some barbeque events throughout the week. Email me or call me if you think you might try to make it out for all or part of the week.
