FINANCIAL SUMMARY

Expenses for grounds equipment maintenance are above budget, partly because of repair of the power steering for the small tractor. The costs of glider annuals were higher than forecast; the Grob-103 wing AD compliance effort contributed to aircraft maintenance budget being exceeded. Tow plane maintenance expense has nearly reached double the annual budget. Income now includes transfers from reserves which accounts for \$3,567 of the excess of actual income relative to budget.

FUEL INDEX ADJUSTED

The recent delivery of gas was at an increased cost of \$3.32 per gallon. Also, during engine break-in 909 has been burning 100LL aviation fuel. Consequently, the fuel index has increased to \$0.32 per hundred feet, effective July 1.

A WESTERN SOARING VACATION by Dan Reagan

If you have an extra few weeks of vacation and you don't mind driving a few thousand miles, then a soaring vacation in Utah and Nevada is just what you need.

Last month I traveled to Parowan, Utah to attend the Auxiliary Power Sailplane Association camp which lasted from June 14th until June 26th. They allow ten standard (gravity) gliders to attend along with the thirty or so motorgliders. To make sure I would get enough soaring, I arrived a week early on June 7th and immediately watched high cirrus clouds and 45 knot winds eliminate any chance of flying for the next nine days. But when the conditions changed the soaring was great for the next two weeks.

Parowan is located at the border of the Great Basin desert to the west, and north-south mountain ranges and canyon lands to the east. On good soaring days the eastern air mass (mountain air) and the western air mass (desert) converge causing clouds to form marking this convergence line where lift is fantastic. Good days allow flying at over 100 miles per hour at 17,000 feet for long distances without ever turning. On one flight a 2 ½ hour segment covered 421 kilometers (261 miles) at 104 miles an hour while taking only two thermals (a six knot and a nine knot). The conditions can be fantastic!

As a bonus the terrain holds scenery such as Bryce Canyon National Park, Zion National Park, Grand Canyon National Park, Glenn Canyon National Recreation Area, and canyon lands that are indescribable.

Since I was scheduled to meet John Lubon and Joe Simmers in Minden, Nevada on approximately June 27th, I departed Parowan on June 26th.

Minden, NV is located adjacent to the Sierra Nevada Mountain range in the valley just below Lake Tahoe. From Minden the Sierra Nevada Mountains extend approximately 75 miles to the north and about 375 miles to the south into California. The scenery during flights is again breath taking with Lake Tahoe on the north end and Yosemite National Park to the south. Mount Whitney, which is the highest point in the contiguous U. S. at 14,505 feet tall, is south of Yosemite a few miles. Again, the view of this area from a glider is indescribable.

John, Joe, and I flew seven consecutive fun filled days in Minden until I had to head to Denver to visit my daughter. John and Joe stayed behind to fly for a few more days. In eight straight days we flew 7713 miles in 115 hours.

While we were in Minden the Perlan Project (the glider designed to soar to 90,000 feet) was in a

local hangar going through its final assembly and packing. It was being put in a container to be shipped to South America for its flight in the Andes Mountains.

So, start your plans now for your next summer western soaring vacation. You won't regret it. IT'S A BLAST!!
