SCHEDULE OF FEES AND DUES REVISED

ANNUAL FIELD FLIGHT REVIEW REQUIRED NOW

Remember that CCSC has a requirement that each member complete an annual CCSC Field Flight Review with a CCSC instructor and get the instructor's endorsement in his/her logbook prior to acting as PIC of any CCSC glider (UOP 4.2-Pilot Qualifications). Your first CCSC glider flight of the year must be with an instructor. Take advantage of the good winter days ahead to get the requirement completed well in advance of the great spring soaring that is sure to follow. You will want to spend your time soaring then, not waiting for your turn to do the Flight Review. Also, check your logbook. Do you need to complete the FAR 61.56 Flight Review this year? If so, why not combine the two flight reviews and get both completed when they will not interfere with the soaring you want to do during the great weather later this year.


SAFETY CORNER ... TREES ... THE ONES YOU MAY NOT BE SEEING!

CCSC pilots demonstrate a healthy respect for the trees on the approach end of runway 09. Those trees are very obvious and the natural instinct is to give them wide vertical berth during landing. What about the those trees though at the approach end of runway 27? Trees, what trees?

I am not referring to the trees that set back about 700 feet from Elbon Road. You'd have to really mess up a pattern for those to be a problem during landing. The concern is the narrow line of trees oriented parallel with the runway 27 landing lanes. While most pilots land on the south side of runway 27 and so do not come close to these trees, occasionally a slight pattern overshoot, the need to deconflict from aircraft that just landed, or perhaps the need to land on a drier part of the runway can bring a pilot close to these rather tall trees. When this happens, it is easy to be so focused on the landing that the pilot can lose consideration of these trees, especially considering the very long wingspan of a glider.

During my field check last year the instructor spoke up (good!) about his concern with the trees as I approached runway 27 to land. For this pattern, I had to offset a bit north due to traffic that had just landed. That, combined with being on a not-steep approach, brought my right wing a bit close to the tree line. Here' a picture from that flight...with accurate altitude and ground track information... from SeeYou:



I have seen others come quite close to this tree line both vertically and laterally, and I am not sure they were fully aware. Again, it seems it is particularly easy to forget about those long wings and this tree line when focusing on the end game of the landing.

Anyhow, please pay special attention to these trees when your landing approach is not well to the south or north side of runway 27. Likewise, if you see someone come uncomfortably close to the trees, do them a favor and let them know what you saw. Crew Chiefs, Ground Crews, and especially Instructors, please keep an eye out for this trend item.

GROB-102 PLAN FOR 2017 - UNLIMITED FLIGHTS FOR SINGLE A/C USE FEE

Ten members have indicated a desire to prepay \$90 for Grob-102 Aircraft Use Fees in order to be authorized to fly up to 2-hour blocks as many times as they want for the rest of the year with no additional Aircraft Use Fee. Other members will be charged \$25 for each Aircraft Use and will be limited to 1-hour blocks. The Hook-up Fee, Basic Tow Fee and Altitude Index Fee will follow the Schedule of Fees and Dues for all pilots, only the Aircraft Use Fee and the flight duration limit are different. This is the same arrangement for the Baby Grob as for the past two years. The \$90 G-102 Fee will appear on the March statement, payable by March 31, for the ten who are on the list. Each of the ten **PrePay members should have received a confirming email** by the time you read this. If you requested to be on the list but did not receive the confirming email contact Jim Dudley promptly.
