In order to encourage the preservation of our aging fleet of 1--26 s, an important part each year is the Spiffy Award. There were a lot of beautifully maintained 1--26 s competing: The winner was 091 owned my Norm Miller. Many of you remember this as the 1--26 formally belienryMeyerrose and restored by Cub Stewart.


