SSA STATE RECORDS - OHIO Greg Crook, SSA State Governor and Record Keeper

2004 was an especially good year for several of our Caesar Creek pilots. Brad Towne, Brian Stoops and passenger Katie Menchen, John Lubon and Steve Kaltenbach all qualified for Soaring Records in the State of Ohio. In several cases their flights also qualified for SSA Badge legs, which made these flights especially important. This is quite an accomplishment.

Badge and record fights do not come easily. First, these pilots had to master the skills they needed to fly their sailplanes at an advanced level. Then, they needed to prepare themselves and their equipment for these flights. Pilot preparation was especially critical. These were not short duration flights. All of these pilots were in the air for at least 4 hours and two were in the air for over 6 hours. Their flight equipment included a barograph or a flight data recorder, which had to be calibrated, sealed and secured in their aircraft so it would document the entire flight. Each of these flights also had an official observer who was responsible for verifying that the flight procedures were conducted according to the rules. After landing the flight information had to be handled properly so that there could be no doubt as to the accuracy of the data that was collected. Finally, these pilots had to be ready to fly on a day that would provide them the conditions they needed to accomplish those flights.

Believe me, for all of these steps to come together and to satisfy all of the rules and regulations for a successful badge or record flight is not easy. For most of these pilots this was not their first attempt at a badge or record flight and I think it is safe to say this will not be their last attempt either. These pilots have certainly gained my respect and they deserve your respect as well.

CCSC Annual Meeting

The CCSC Annual meeting was held at the CCSC Clubhouse as scheduled on Tuesday, November 9th, 2004. The meeting was called to order at approximately 7:30 PM. CCSC Board Minutes

6 November 2004

In attendance were Joe Jackson, President; Brian Stoops, Operations; Dave Menchen, Maintenance; Bill Paar, Grounds; Dick Holzwarth, Social; Dave Rawson, Publicity; Jim Lowe, Treasurer; and Rolf Hegele, Secretary. The minutes from the previous meeting were reviewed and approved. It was noted that the TSA has granted an exemption for gliders to the Flight Training for Aliens Interim Final Rule (IFR). Unfortunately it was nine days after the rule had to be implemented. We apologize for any inconvenience this caused our membership, but we had to comply with the IFR. The treasurer's report was also approved following a discussion about continuing gas price increases. It was decided to wait until the new Board meets next month and Rolf Hegele completes the tow plane cost analysis before considering an increase in tow fees. It was also recommended that we consider a surcharge rather than a standard increase. An additional purchase of hats and sweaters was also approved. There was also a discussion about e-mailing bills and the newsletter. Unfortunately not everyone has e-mail and the administration required to maintain e-mail addresses is significant. The club is not structured to perform that task at this time.

The election of new officers is scheduled for the following Tuesday, November 9 at 7:30 PM at the clubhouse. It was encouraged that the Board and club members attend. One of our newest student members, Matt Wiebe, died unexpectedly and had several training flights outstanding. Several members volunteered to pay for his tows and clear his bill. Thanks to all.

It was also recommended that several dead trees be cut to expand the roadway leading to the west end of the field. Bill Paar will coordinate this with nearby trailer owners prior to its implementation. Terry West requested our support of his program to teach High School students about flying. He will be encouraged to present his program at the next Board meeting. A review of the delinquent accounts recommended two members for termination.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
