
SPRING IS COMING...

Candidates Needed for SSD Board - Elections at April 11 SSD Annual Meeting!

Have you ever wondered who makes the decisions about buying and selling equipment or constructing or renovating buildings at CCSC? Those responsibilities belong to the Soaring Society of Dayton, a for-profit corporation which owns the property and equipment used by CCSC. SSD is governed by a 9-member board whose members serve 3-year terms staggered so that each year 3 board members are elected. Current board members whose terms are due to expire in April are Wally Detert, Dieter Schmidt, and Buck Towne. Continuing board members are John Lubon, Dave Edwards, Norb Maurer, Bill Maxwell, Lucy Anne McKosky, and Bob Root.

Elections for the SSD Board will take place at the SSD Annual Meeting on April 11, 2007. Ballots will be mailed to all stockholders in late March and should be returned promptly. Stockholders get one vote for each share of stock they own, and a quorum equal to 50% of the total number of outstanding shares is required.

If you would like to get involved in making decisions about the property and equipment which CCSC depends on, you are invited to run for a seat on the board. To the Caesar Creek Soaring Club Members,

I would like to thank you all for a productive and prosperous 2006. Happy 2007!

I have guarded OPTIMISM for our glider club for the coming year. Life is a road, not a destination. In that spirit, I would like all of us to identify a few individual and club goals and move along the road this coming year toward these goals.

Will we, as individuals and as a club, muddle through? Or, will we improve and grow. If our club is to improve and grow, we do not need more airspace restrictions, more restrictive FARs, more laws/lawsuits, lackadaisical flying by club members, arbitrary financing, abused equipment and/or more club restrictions. We do need the sport to be viewed as easy for entry/transition/daily continuity, yet at the same time challenging, environmentally and socially friendly, economical, fun, and near-by.

I have a few wishes and goals for the club again this year, many of which cost nothing, and should make our club even better... My goals are ways to improve club communication, to increase membership, to increase our flying and efficiencies, to improve our flying skills, to increase work productivity and spread the workload through more and better volunteerism. To get a couple more pieces of equipment, to have fun, and finally share and spread the sport.

With this in mind I have set some of the following personal goals for this coming year's flying season

- 1) More Flights for the year Safe, Less Cost per Flight, Perhaps a Winch?
- 2) Increase active membership Students, Private Pilots/Instructors/Commercial Pilots, Tow Pilots
- 3) Increase Volunteerism Doing more by learning new things, new jobs and filling flight line lulls with productivity around other parts of the glider port.
- 4) Improve Flight Training Push and promote Cross Country and Light Sport Aircraft-Glider Training Programs; Get members to upgrade their private ratings to Commercial/ Instructor/Tow Pilot; Provide streamlined/efficient student training; License the professional student; Grow all piloting Skills; Foster other support and trade skills i.e. Red Cross, Maintenance Training among others.
- 5) Improve Communication within the Club Help develop electronic crew chief reports to the Board (and appropriate Board redistribution), Foster better recognition of members piloting progress, Welcomes/Departures, anniversaries.
- 6) Purchase of a 1-26 (equivalent) replacement, or another 2-33, and possibly a GPS/Datalogger for club XC flights.
- 7) Look into having Sat/Sun Fly-In's to the glider port in April & May and or August & September, to help make friends provide membership opportunities, and monies from demo flights, selling bag meals having BBQ's, and camping events.
- 8) Have safe, fun and productive encampments Nationals Competition(June), Youth Camp(July), Adult Soaring Camp(August), Wright Memorial/Labor Day (1-26), Socials, other times you are staying out at the field.

- 9) Promote Goal/Badge/Record attainment and recognition; Start an inventory and record progress in SSA badge program, progress in Cross Country training/flights/records in club gliders, More "Just-for-Fun" Excursions
- 10) Organize an Adult Soaring Week in August LSA-G start-to-finish; Pre-license and licensing; Pre-solo; Cross Country training and Badge work; Supervised Post-solo; Post-solo, Biennial Flight Reviews; Just-for-fun flights (Mentors first, then Badge attempts, Volunteer Reward flights next, and others last); Guest rides
- 11) Record and Disseminate SSD & CCSC Histories and Personalities Record living histories and old photos to permanent video library

Please help the club this year by coming out and flying, volunteering, being observant and communicative. Seek out and invite new prospective members. Encourage our current membership to excel. That's what I'll be doing.

CCSC Board Meeting Minutes - 3 March 2007

In attendance were Andrew Dignan, President; Jim Lowe, Treasurer; Jim Goebel, Vice President; Dave Rawson, Facilities; Maury Drummey, Social and Membership; Paul McClaskey, Tow Plane Maintenance; and Rolf Hegele, Secretary

Presidents Report. It was noted that there are a number of reports the Board should have on a monthly basis. Andrew and Rolf will get with Sara to identify the reports and how to get them to the Board. Included would be membership numbers, new member applications, delinquencies and terminations. Andrew will set up a SOARCCSC.COM address for future membership data updates. He will also review the list of Board responsibilities with the Board members to ensure everyone understands their assignments. The Flight Instructor Renewal Clinic (FIRC) is scheduled for March 10 & 11.

Secretary's Report. The Minutes from the previous meeting were reviewed and approved with the addition of the Open Items.

Treasurers Report. The report indicated that despite our lack of flying our finances are still on budget. The taxes will be completed next week. The treasurer's report was approved.

Facilities Report. Dave found some more spare sockets for updating the electrical system. The drop cords for charging the batteries still need to be wired. It was noted that we lost some roofing on the east side of the barn and will need to be replaced.

The Clean-Up Day was selected as April 14th with Sunday the 15th being the back-up day. Andrew will put an announcement in the Newsletter. Dave will prepare a list of the work items so they can be addressed promptly.

Tow Plane Maintenance. The week after the 33Z annual, the throttle cable broke and is being repaired. The 909 annual is complete. Andrew will establish an on-line maintenance schedule.

Glider Maintenance. No report.

Operations. The Crew Chief reports are not being used effectively and Andrew will lead a team to develop appropriate procedures. Andrew is also working on updating the crew lists. 7 April has been selected as the date for a Crew Chiefs and Assistants meeting. Rolf will e-mail the notice.

Social and Publicity. Maury will determine a schedule for the 2007 social functions and get the dates publicized. Our next social function will be a pot luck dinner on 17 March. The Club will provide the refreshments. Please see the Newsletter for further information. Maury also wants to emphasize member accomplishments this year as well as at the Annual Banquet, i.e. solos, licenses, special flights, etc. There was also a suggestion to exhibit a glider in an extreme sports expo and emphasize the advantages of a Club environment. No determination was made at this time.

Sports Class Nationals. We now have 32 entrants against a limit of 50. Andy McQuigg will be our CD. Dick organized an initial cleanup and the inside of the clubhouse has been painted. Thanks to all who participated.

Old Business

- Instructor's Clinic is scheduled for March 10 and 11.
- · Safety Policy Signs will be prepared for the Clubhouse and the operations trailer
- Emergency Response Plan Dave M has e-mailed crew chiefs to identify their interest in First Aid and CPR training.
- Liability Insurance There was further discussion about our liability insurance because of the question whether it was enough. Andrew will solicit additional quotes and sources and Maury will ask another insurance consultant for his recommendations.
- Flight Card Update The BFR/Last 90 Endorsement Date will be added to the flight card
- Financial Software Andrew will review Quick Books as a possible replacement for our current software which is becoming unsupportable.
- Tow Pilot Qualifications Are identified in the Tow Pilots Manual. It has not been updated recently and Paul will be provided a soft copy and review any needed changes.
- Equipment Upgrades Andrew was authorized to replace the copying machine in the office and the computer in the clubhouse.

New Business

- Duplicate SSA Fees Previous boards agreed to reimburse John Murray for dual memberships in the SSA due to his business affiliation. It was agreed to reimburse John for this year.
- Election Process Dennis Fisher presented some voting recommendations based on Roberts Rules of Order. After discussion, the issue was tabled until next month to allow everyone time to review the paperwork he provided.
- Painting Party The Board thanked Dick Holzwarth for organizing the painting party and expressed appreciation for his efforts. Approval was also given to reimburse Henry for the paint.
- Golf Cart Tires It was noted that three golf carts had flat tires because of being driven and turned sharply
 with under inflated tires. It was recommended that desired tire pressures be marked on the appropriate rims
 and checked as part of the normal maintenance procedures.

The meeting was then adjourned.
