Adult Soaring Camp

Thanks to a great job of organizing and promoting by Eric Cochran, the event got off to fine start on <u>Monday</u>, August 25th. The first day of the 2nd annual Adult Soaring Camp was attended by 22 members.

Gary Print conducted a ground school on weather for several students in the morning. Bob Root served as Crew Chief and arranged for each student to be lined up with an instructor for the afternoon. Later, a lot of ground instruction took place under the tent after flying commenced. Instructors and tow pilots on hand to kick off Day 1 were Jim Bierstine, Rich Carraway, Charlie DeBerry, Jim Goebel, Gordon Penner, Jim Price and Garry Print. The day was overcast with limited soaring but was pleasant nonetheless and 19 flights were completed.

At the end of the day our organizer Eric Cochran treated us to free beer on the porch. When asked what was the reason for the "beer buying event" he said "because it's Monday". Sounded like a good reason to us.

<u>Tuesday</u> started with sunshine and we were hopeful that the day would bring some thermals. This was especially true for four pilots hoping to get some cross country On Line Contest miles in after Monday's disappointing weather. Don Burns, Devin Bargainnier, Joe Simmers and John Zanon finally conceded that it would be a weak soaring day at best, and it was. Again however, the temperature was a very pleasant 79 degrees and it was great just to be outside flying on a late summer day. Several club members worked the hookups and glider retrieves notably Lucy Anne McKosky and Charlie Richardson.

The "students", ranging from early pre-solo to power transition pilots, were Eric Cochran, Dave Coucke, Steve Fenstermaker, Randy Orem, Lorrie Penner, Charlie Richardson, Bill Smith, Marcin Swiderski and Mike Wilkins. We made 18 flights on Tuesday. Tuesday evening the remnants of tropical storm Fay made their way into the area and stayed with us all day <u>Wednesday</u>. Of course, since it was Wednesday, a large group showed for breakfast at Der Dutchman. Later back in the clubhouse, we used INTERNET to look at some widely used tools for developing a soaring forecast. Some of the guys used the time to study for their knowledge tests. The day stayed overcast with occasional showers.





The forecast <u>Thursday</u> morning was for the overcast to clear and a mix of sun and clouds to develop in the afternoon. People started showing up about 10AM and by noon a couple of shafts of sunlight were getting through. Meanwhile Dick Eckels was putting Alex Rytel through the oral part of the test for a Private Pilot Glider rating. Marcin Swiderski was in the clubhouse taking the pre-solo written test in anticipation of getting to solo in the ASK 21. It turned out to be a reasonably good soaring day but it was hard to connect over the field, the best lift being farther west and north. Dick Scheper was the principal tow pilot with John Antrim helping later. Also, Lynn Alexander joined us to instruct. Don Burns, Dieter Schmidt and Jim Price all did some cross country flying. When the day was done 24 flights were completed. The highlights were Marcin flying his first two solo flights and Alex Rytel earning his Private Pilot rating. These were "beer buying events" and we enjoyed the occasion on the porch.

A cold front approached on <u>Friday</u> morning and so there was the possibility of showers and thunderstorms ahead of the front. Sometimes this makes for great soaring as long as you can dodge the serious stuff. We had sun and cu's until late afternoon when the rumbles of thunder began. We did 16 more flights on Friday. Lucy Anne McKosky went with Jim Price attempting a cross country flight but the lift was a bit hard to work at first. They did finally work their way up in good lift and went out to the flea market. By then Lucy had run out of time. At the end of the day, Charlie Richardson got to 4600 AGL in a 2-33 solo flight.



To cap the week off Pat DeNaples went to Domino's to pick up 4 large pizzas and we had pizza and beer on the porch. In summary we did 77 flights in the four days that we flew. Marcin Swiderski was named "student of the week" by acclamation since he flew the most flights – ten. He also was signed off to solo in the ASK 21 and took 4 solo flights afterward. Marcin took his first flights in 1992 as part of the Ohio State University youth group that Rob Cluxton recruited but got off on other pursuits and just came back to soaring recently. Alex Rytel made us proud by earning his Private Glider rating. Way to go Alex and CCSC Youth Soaring! Several other pilots made at least 7 training flights including Bill Smith and Steve Fenstermaker. It was a good week.

CCSC Board Meeting Minutes

September 6, 2008

In attendance were Andrew Dignan, President; Rolf Hegele, Secretary; Dave Menchen, VP; Maury Drummey, Social; Paul McClaskey, Tow Planes; Gerry Proffitt, Facilities; Steve McManus, Glider Maintenance; and Jim Goebel, Operations.

Secretary – The minutes from the August meeting were reviewed and accepted with one correction and clarification. A different color flight card for XC flights was presented and comments will be implemented. We also reviewed four new membership applications. All applicants were approved: Brian Patrick Milligan, Austin Webb, Connor Lindsey, and Bernie Fullenkamp. WELCOME ALL!

Treasurer – The August financial statement was summarized but indicated we have about \$44,000 available. However we also have to pay the SSA dues and the quarterly lease payment this coming month. The Treasurer's Report was approved. Facilities - The clubhouse computer has been sent for repair a second time. The electric to the gas pump has been repaired, but it was recommended that the junction box be removed from the side of the silo. Dave Coucke and John Zanon performed the repairs. The Clubhouse siding has been replaced but the eaves end caps still need to be replaced. Special thanks to Henry Meyerrose and John Murray and the entire 4th Saturday Crew. Charlie Richardson is working on the block house.

Tow Plane Maintenance – All towplanes are operational.

Glider Maintenance – All aircraft are back in service. ASK CC is missing the rear spoiler handle. WHOEVER WALKED OFF WITH THE HANDLE, PLEASE RETURN, NO QUESTIONS ASKED!!! The 1-34 will have new seat belts installed at its annual. Tom McDonald volunteered to develop some safety articles for the newsletter.

Operations –The Board is still awaiting the Safety Board Reviews on three separate incidents. It was recommended that we publicize the incidents in some sort of Safety Corner without attribution. Crew Chief reports still have not been automated (but will be shortly after the invoice process has been updated).

Social – We will hold our Neighbor Appreciation Day / Oktoberfest on Saturday, October 18. Andrew will cook the Ox Roast. The Annual Banquet is scheduled for 17 January at 6PM. It was also approved to provide \$250 for the Ladies Holiday Luncheon.

Old Business – The winch committee met and decided to defer the winch demonstration to mid October to ensure that the neighboring fields have been harvested and provide an additional margin of safety. There was also a request that we release any of the 2-33s and the Blanik to allow member winching flights at Waynesville with corresponding over and return costs being the responsibilities of the member doing the flying. Any flights of Club aircraft would only be with a qualified instructor in the rear seat, Jim Goebel. After significant discussion, a motion was made and seconded to allow the club 2-33s to be used at Waynesville for winch launching with the approval of the corresponding crew chief and with a designated winch CFIG (no solo flights). The motion passed with 5 affirmative votes and 3 against.

New Business – Andrew announced that updates to the website will be implemented shortly including a Google calendar and a member's only portion. This will use your member e-mail and account number as password. Linda Murray volunteered to manage the Regional contest next June. She recommended the 2cd week of June but it was recommended to the Board that it be deferred to the 3rd week since we've had such good luck with that week of weather. The Board approved the expenditure of \$150 for the application with the provision that a budget be presented to the Board within 60 days. There was also discussion about fuel costs and the model we are using for automatic increases of the tow fee. It was felt that there should be a fixed portion of the tow fee with the actual cost of fuel being represented with a smaller increase. The Board will review a revised model for discussion at the next meeting.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 11:47 pm.
