YEW 2017

Youth Education Week 2017 ran from Sunday to Friday, July 9-14. Although thunderstorms interferred with flight activities several of those days good advantage was taken of all breaks in the weather. Half the campers completed their first solo or passed their Private Pilot Practical Test.

CONGRATULATIONS ETHAN MAXWELL

As the sun was sinking in the west Chloe was unable to find thermals to extend her first solo flight so she decided to do it again to get a little more time to enjoy the thrill of solo flight. By 7:52 pm she was off for her second solo flight.



After a perfect landing that also came to an end all too quickly and it was time to put N3616Q back in the hangar and to celebrate with the traditional cooling-off ceremony.



It was appropriate that the soaking got both Chloe and her grandfather, Bill Gabbard, who provided most of her flight instruction because it was hard to tell who was happier and more proud.

CONGRATULATIONS CHRISTIAN MAURER - PRIVATE PILOT

Christian Maurer was also busy at YEW, both with his flying and studying for the oral portion of the Practical Test. It was Sunday, July 16, before he got his chance and by then he was ready!

Christian arrived at last week's Youth Education Week with the intent of preparing for the practical test and receiving an instructor's recommendation for the checkride. He worked very diligently with Bob Anderson, completing six training flights and many hours of groundwork. At the conclusion of YEW, Bob completed the required sign-off. Then came the checkride with Bob Miller and Christian reportedly did very well.

As his primary instructor, I had the opportunity to track his progress over the past three years. He started training in June 2014 on the first Sunday crew. At that time he was thirteen, so he couldn't solo until the following June, and he achieved that goal on the 13th, one week after his fourteenth birthday. He had twenty-six training flights and could have soloed earlier, if not for the "age issue". He traveled to Germany twice with his family and received some winch training there. Now with the checkride successfully completed, he is a full-fledged glider pilot. He intends to work on the Commercial and then the CFIG, which I fully support because perhaps I can then retire and start receiving my CCSC pension! In the short term, Christian plans to start power training at Waynesville airport so that he can fly dad's J-3 Cub and Cessna 140, and maybe at some future date, even the

Pitts as well! In the early stages of his training, I was always impressed with his smooth and wellmannered technique which I attribute not just to his natural skill, but also to the hours he spent flying with dad in the family Cub. After all, a 2-33 is nothing more than a Champ or J-3 without the engine!

We should note that Christian represents a "third generation" pilot in the Maurer family. His granddad, Otto, was a long-time CCSC icon and a very dedicated and active instructor. His dad, Norb, and uncle, Manfred, both soloed at an early age, and eventually progressed into the power world and then became towpilots. Both are also active glider pilots.

We are all very proud of Christian, and know that he can accomplish any aviation goal that he decides to pursue! - Rich Carraway

HELP FINDING SOMEONE TO SWAP CREW DAY ASSIGNMENTS

A web-based process for facilitating swapping crew day assignments was announced in the 2/21/2017 Frequent Flyer along with instructions for using the system. This process is intended to help members find another member who will agree to swap crew duties for one specific set of dates. It is **not** for getting reassigned to a different crew for an indefinite period. Brian Stoops is the person who oversees crew assignments, so Brian is the one to whom you need to speak about a long term change.

Remember that **UOP 2.2 CREW MEMBER DUTIES** states: "All crew members are to report for duty at 9:30 AM and work until released by the Crew Chief. Each crew member is personally responsible for arranging for a qualified substitute in case of his or her absence. Scheduled crew members are expected to be present for each of their scheduled crew days regardless of flying conditions." This new process does not relieve any crew member of the responsibility for arranging for a qualified substitute in the responsibility for arranging for a qualified substitute and informing the crew chief; rather it is intended to help accomplish that task.

As of 6:00 pm on 7/18/2017 there are five requests for a member to swap or substitute a crew day.
