SATURDAY WAS GOOD FOR THE CCSC ON LINE CONTEST TEAM



Chuck Lohre is shown returning to CCSC on Saturday after his cross country flight. With this flight Chuck helped the CCSC team secure 5th place in round 17 of the Gold League On Line Contest. The portion of Chuck's flight that was considered in the scoring covered 103.4 km at an average speed of 41.3 km/hr. Dieter Schmidt also flew from CCSC on Saturday and helped the team with an average speed of 64.6 km/hr over a 161.6 km portion of his flight. Flying from Garner, TX, John Lubon led the CCSC team with an average speed of 83.6 km/hr over a 208.9 km portion of his flight. Saturday was one of the best days for our team this year with a total of six pilots submitting flights to OLC: John Lubon, Dieter Schmidt, Chuck Lohre, Mark Miller, Joe simmers and Jim Marks. For a change the weather was good enough that five of those flights were over Ohio. Overall after 17 rounds of OLC Gold League competition the CCSC team is in 12th place out of the 18 teams in the nationwide competition. Twenty one CCSC members have submitted a total of 207 flights to OLC so far this year. Dan Reagan is the leading point generator from his 24 submitted flights.

JOHN LUBON AND JOHN MURRAY COMPETING IN SSA 18 METER NATIONALS

Both John Lubon (JL) and John Murray (LX) are competing in the SSA 18 Meter Nationals in Uvalde, TX. The contest is scheduled to run August 1-10. At this writing official results are posted only for the first day of flying but the unofficial results as of the end of the fifth day, Saturday, 8/5/17, indicate that John Murray is in 22nd place, still slightly ahead of John Lubon in 25th place out of a field of 35 contestants.

2017 WRIGHT MEMORIAL CONTEST - STEVE STATKUS

The rain-delayed 2017 WMC will take place during the upcoming Adult Camp, August 7-11. I call it an event, rather than a contest to emphasize the low stress aspect of the event. We'll have two categories of gliders, the Bunnies and Turtles. If your glider is white, you're a bunny. If your glider has some fabric on it, you're a turtle.

The contest will run every day during the week. There will be two basic tasks: turn point distance (Bunnies) and turn point and duration for the Turtles. The turn point distance will be scored using OLC. This will not be your usual turn point task. CCSC will be the locus of several rays extending out as far as you are willing to go. Just cross the three rays at any distance from the locus and you've completed the task. The farther out you go, the higher the score. Multiple attempts may be made throughout the week and the best score by Friday gets the trophy. For the Turtle duration, OLC again but we accumulate flight time for the week. Highest accumulated time wins.

This event is designed to encourage club members to compete in club aircraft. K-21's are Bunnies and 2-33's will compete as Turtles. Come on out for the week and have some fun. We'll be grilling and chilling.

Oh, did I mention that we'll be doing the bomb drop contest and spot landing for cash? Yep. It's gonna be a week of fun flying and companionship. Yea it'll be hot but we'll have ample cool water and shade. And, the temp drops 5 degrees per thousand feet so there's no reason to sit on the field and sweat. Hope to see you there and good luck beating #242 in the Turtle class.

CINCINNATI FLIGHT SAFETY DISTRICT OFFICE PROTECTING US

Steve Statkus reports that on Wednesday Stan Faske from the Cincinnati FSDO came to CCSC and asked if he could inspect the engines on 33Z and 48L for non-airworthy hardware. Steve escorted Stan to the tow plane hanger and opened 48L's cowling for his inspection. Stan's associate used his cell phone to take a couple photos of the intake manifold mounting bolts which he declared were non-aircraft (grade 8) hardware. The story is that Signature (who did our overhauls) has been found to be using non-standard hardware on intake manifolds on both Continental and Lycoming engines as far back as 2008. They repeated the inspection on 33Z with the same result. Stan called Cubby and he agreed to replace the bolts with standard aircraft hardware at his earliest opportunity. Stan did not ground our operation saying they have not had a single failure of this bolt since they began looking but he did tell us that we were operating non-airworthy aircraft until the bolts are replaced. These bolts hold the intake manifold risers to the cylinder heads and are a very low stress item that will not compromise the structural integrity of the engine. Tim Christman reports that Cubby has the correct bolts on order and started replacing the non-aircraft bolts and will complete replacing them in all three of our tow planes when the new supply of correct bolts is received.

TRAFFIC ALERT

While the above conversation with Stan Faske was taking place a turbine powered Cessna Caravan flew down the middle of our runway from west to east at about 800 feet AGL while the K21 was making a mid field cross wind pattern entry from the north. I would not consider the event a close call, but neither aircraft made any attempt to avoid the other. I'm pretty sure the K21 saw the Cessna, but not so sure the Cessna saw the Glider. - Steve Statkus

HELP FINDING SOMEONE TO SWAP CREW DAY ASSIGNMENTS

A web-based process for facilitating swapping crew day assignments was announced in the 2/21/2017 Frequent Flyer along with instructions for using the system. This process is intended to help members find another member who will agree to swap crew duties for one specific set of dates. It is **not** for getting reassigned to a different crew for an indefinite period. Brian Stoops is the person who oversees crew assignments, so Brian is the one to whom you need to speak about a long term change.

Remember that **UOP 2.2 CREW MEMBER DUTIES** states: "All crew members are to report for duty at 9:30 AM and work until released by the Crew Chief. Each crew member is personally responsible for arranging for a qualified substitute in case of his or her absence. Scheduled crew members are expected to be present for each of their scheduled crew days regardless of flying conditions." This new process does not relieve any crew member of the responsibility for arranging for a qualified substitute in the responsibility for arranging for a qualified substitute and informing the crew chief; rather it is intended to help accomplish that task.
