CONGRATULATIONS ZACH SIEFKER - CFI-G



Zach Siefker achieved another big goal on Monday, October 9. He passed the Practical Test for Certified Flight Instructor - Glider. It was not without its challenges because the weather that was forecast to clear by 3 PM did not clear sufficiently for the test to be conducted until 6:15 PM. A few of the flights were completed earlier in the day despite the low cloud ceiling, but higher ceilings were necessary for some of the required maneuvers for the practical test. That gave Zach adequate opportunity to demonstrate to Bob Miller that he has sufficient knowledge of the weather and all the other oral exam topics to qualify for the Flight Instructor rating. Meanwhile Don Green waited patiently with a tow plane ready for any break in the clouds. Larry Kirkbride was Zach's primary instructor in preparing for the CFI-G test. Dieter Schmidt also helped by flying the tow plane for some of Zach's last minute preparations and practice.

Originally from the Columbus area, Zach is a senior at University of Cincinnati, majoring in Electrical Engineering. He has worked all of his co-op assignments for Duke Energy, designing substations, etc. Zach's interest is now expanding to include powered aircraft. In fact, he is exploring the possibility of joining the Air Force in order to pilot more advanced aircraft while keeping his options open with Duke Energy. Congratulations to Zach.

CONGRATULATIONS DAN KATUZIENSKI - FIRST SOLO GLIDER FLIGHT - OHIO

Dan Katuzienski arrived in Ohio in August 2017, eager to start the Air Force Institute of Technology (AFIT) at W.P.A.F.B. He and his wife, Hattie, have been married 2-1/2 years. Dan studied meteorology at Virginia Tech and now is preparing to be a meteorologist for the Air Force. One of first things that he did when coming to the area was to join CCSC and resume his training as a glider

pilot. Dan already holds a Private Pilot Certificate (ASEL) and has about 250 hours of powered flight time. After joining the Air Force in July 2015 Dan had an opportunity to experience soaring flight in a program with Blue Ridge Soaring Society very similar to what the W.P.A.F.B.Airmen Recreation Program does at CCSC. He started his training in piloting gliders and completed



his first glider solo flight at Blue Ridge Soaring Society in a Blanik. So, it is not quite right to say that he completed his first solo glider flight on Saturday, but he was treated as if it were his first solo in most respects. In fact, Zach Siefker (L.) made his first logbook entries as a CFI-G, providing the second endorsement for Dan (R.) to solo after Bob Anderson (C.) had given his endorsement as primary instructor. Congratulations Dan, and welcome to CCSC. By the way, Dan has agreed to give a seminar on meteorology for glider pilots sometime this coming winter.

Weather permitting the plan is for the Third Saturday Crew to conduct normal operations while others complete the many fix-up projects because this Saturday is Neighbor Appreciation Day and generally many of our surrounding neighbors accept our invitation for a free glider flight.

Here is a brief overview of some of the projects that received attention on October 14.



Gutter guards were installed on the south side of the glider hangar after the accumulated pine needles and other debris were cleaned from the gutters. Tony Rein (ground), Dieter Schmidt (ladder) and Pete Schradin (roof) were kept busy completing that project.



Removal of dead trees started on the north side of the runway. John Lubon, Bill Hall (?) and Dan Reagan made firewood out of dead wood and quickly moved on to bigger targets.



At the west end of the runway the dead ashes near where the awning is set up were soon reduced to a pile of fireplace-length chunks.



Meanwhile overhead the joy of flight continued.

CORRECTION REGARDING DIRECTOR ROLES

By unanimous vote of the other directors on October 7, 2017, Brian Stoops was appointed to be a director in keeping with the Code of Regulations to maintain the Board at full strength with 11 members. He is filling the vacancy created when Bernie Fullenkamp resigned earlier this year. In the 10/10/2017 Frequent Flyer there was an error in the description of the roles of two directors - Brian's new role and Mark Miller's new role were reversed.

Brian has agreed to take on the responsibilities for Airport Operations, including oversight of the Clubhouse, the Campground and the hangar spaces rented by individual members. He also will be responsible for club merchandise for sale in the Clubhouse. Mark Miller has been in the Airport Operations leadership role but he has agreed to take the Flight Operations role which includes oversight of Crew Chiefs and coordination with Tow Pilots under the leadership of Tim Christman and Instructors under the leadership of Tom McDonald. All this is shown pictorially in a chart on the website. (The password for the Members-Only pages is printed on your monthly statement.)

HELP FINDING SOMEONE TO SWAP CREW DAY ASSIGNMENTS

A web-based process for facilitating swapping crew day assignments was announced in the 2/21/2017 Frequent Flyer along with instructions for using the system. This process is intended to help members find another member who will agree to swap crew duties for one specific set of dates. It is **not** for getting reassigned to a different crew for an indefinite period. Mark Miller is now the person who oversees crew assignments, so Mark is the one to whom you need to speak about a long term change.

Remember that **UOP 2.2 CREW MEMBER DUTIES** states: "All crew members are to report for duty at 9:30 AM and work until released by the Crew Chief. Each crew member is personally responsible for arranging for a qualified substitute in case of his or her absence. Scheduled crew members are expected to be present for each of their scheduled crew days regardless of flying conditions." This new process does not relieve any crew member from the responsibility for arranging for a qualified substitute and informing the crew chief; rather it is intended to help accomplish that task.

As of 6:00 pm on 10/17/2017 there are no requests for a member to swap or substitute a crew day.
