Making It Back To The Field - Kevin Price, CCSC Safety Officer

On local flights from CCSC, almost everyone makes it back to the field every time. Every now and then though someone lands unplanned at Red Stewart, ends up landing straight-in instead of using a normal pattern or, on even rarer occasions, winds up landing short or in some farmer's field. Pilots use knowledge, experience, skills, judgment and a variety of techniques to remain within a safe and assured gliding distance back to CCSC. Rather than just "winging" it though, pilots would be well-served to quantify and define their personal guidelines for glide range so that they can avoid some embarrassment or, worse yet, a damaged aircraft which could include injuries. This is especially important for gliding in the Midwest where thermals are the primary and often the only source of lift.

We had to deal with the EPA on the project. Odd, but they used a 25-boat marina as the basis for sizing our septic field and thus we are limited to 25 trailers. Yes, hard to believe!

The first of the private hangars (Guy Byars' proposal; he did muich of the planning on this.) had great support from Meyerrose, DeNaples, Maxwell, Root, Stillwagon and many others.

I enjoy reading hard copies of the Frequent Flyer. My last flight was with Don Green in September 2015! He was my safety pilot.

BOARD PROHIBITS DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS ON CCSC PROPERTY

The Saturday, 4 November 2017, meeting of the Board of Directors was well attended by club members who came not just to observe and monitor the decision-making process, but to express their stongly held opinions about a topic which has been a concern for a long time. The current UOP 8.11 has a paragraph that pertains: "HUNTING AND FIREARMS-Hunting or discharging firearms (target practice) on the gliderport property is not permitted during active flight operations or during other scheduled club activities. Persons hunting or discharging firearms must abide by local, state, and federal reglations. Non-members are not permitted hunting or target practice privileges." Many long time members have become concerned that this policy does not adequately protect the club and its members and that it permits an environment which is not appreciated by some members who enjoy using the campground or other facilities when "active flight operations or other scheduled club activities" are not taking place. There was much discussion ranging from when do "active flight operations" start and finish to whether the club's insurance policy provides liability protection for events resulting from firearm discharge. (The current insurance policy is silent on the subject of firearms.) After substantial discussion the following motion was adopted: "Hunting, discharge of firearms, target shoting of any type is prohibited on gliderport property by members and nonmembers." Expect to see new signs posted around the property soon.

HELP FINDING SOMEONE TO SWAP CREW DAY ASSIGNMENTS

A web-based process for facilitating swapping crew day assignments was announced in the 2/21/2017 Frequent Flyer along with instructions for using the system. This process is intended to help members find another member who will agree to swap crew duties for one specific set of dates. It is **not** for getting reassigned to a different crew for an indefinite period. Mark Miller is now the person who oversees crew assignments, so Mark is the one to whom you need to speak about a long term change.

Remember that **UOP 2.2 CREW MEMBER DUTIES** states: "All crew members are to report for duty at 9:30 AM and work until released by the Crew Chief. Each crew member is personally responsible for arranging for a qualified substitute in case of his or her absence. Scheduled crew members are expected to be present for each of their scheduled crew days regardless of flying conditions." This new process does not relieve any crew member from the responsibility for arranging for a qualified substitute in the responsibility for arranging for a qualified substitute and informing the crew chief; rather it is intended to help accomplish that task.

As of 1:00 pm on 11/07/2017 there are two requests for a member to swap or substitute a crew day.
