

ONLINE CONTEST STANDINGS

Round 17 of the OLC Gold League competition was a dismal round for most of the teams with only 7 teams submitting flights that exceeded the score threshold. In fact, the teams that ranked 7th and 6th for the round only submitted 1 and 2 scoreable flights respectively. Team CCSC was not the only team impacted by the weather for this round.

Consequently, after 17 rounds our CCSC team is still in 12th place out of the 18 teams in the OLC Gold League competition. (Thanks to Dieter for the correction: the scoreboard only lists 17 teams, but the last place team is yet to submit flight data for a single flight exceeding the score threshold so they are not even listed on the scoreboard.)

The 13th place team is only 1 point behind CCSC with a score of 52. Nevertheless, Dieter is optimistic about the outcome of this year's competition. The teams in places 15 to 18 will move down to the Silver League at the end of round 19 and the top 4 of the Silver League will move up to the Gold League. We should be ok with our 53 points, but some of the teams below us fly in the western US, so they still have a chance to squeeze us out of the Gold League.

MARKING CONES INSTALLED ON SOUTH SIDE OF RUNWAY- TOM MCDONALD

After a bit of searching, I was able to source some reasonably-priced runway cones from a plastics company in Wisconsin. There are four new ones on the south side of 27, starting from the one that was already there and going west. They are a measured 200 feet apart, so a spot landing after one and without passing the next one meets the Practical Test Standard (PTS) for private pilots. More than halfway but not past, and you are meeting the Commercial standard. (Yes, you do have to decide in advance which two you are going to land between for it to count). They are different colors, white, yellow, or white with a black tip. This gives instructors another way to make it clear which two are to be used for a particular approach.



Whether or not you are using the cones as a reference, make every landing a spot landing. The FAA PTS only judges you on the stopping place, but we train to a higher standard. Aim for a touchdown at a particular spot and at a predetermined speed as well. If you wind up a little short or long of the target you will still have learned something for next time, and be keeping up your skills.

More cones didn't add much to the shipping bill, so I got two extra. They are stashed away for future use.

HELP FINDING SOMEONE TO SWAP CREW DAY ASSIGNMENTS

A web-based process for facilitating swapping crew day assignments was announced in the 2/21/2017 Frequent Flyer along with instructions for using the system. This process is intended to help members find another member who will agree to swap crew duties for one specific set of dates. It is not for getting reassigned to a different crew for an indefinite period. Mark Miller is now the person who oversees crew assignments, so Mark is the one to whom you need to speak about a long term change.

Remember that UOP 2.2 CREW MEMBER DUTIES states: "All crew members are to report for duty at 9:30 AM and work until released by the Crew Chief. Each crew member is personally responsible for arranging for a qualified substitute in case of his or her absence. Scheduled crew members are expected to be present for each of their scheduled crew days regardless of flying conditions." This new process does not relieve any crew member from the responsibility for arranging for a qualified substitute and informing the crew chief; rather it is intended to help accomplish that task. As of 5:00 pm on 8/14/2018 there is one request for a member to swap or substitute a crew day.
