We might have had more but one tow plane needed an oil change. We had two instructors and two tow pilots so we were limited by only having 1 towplane for 3/4 of the day. Special thanks to Haskell Simpson for being the man and the work horse all day, while the other tow pilot was changing oil.

Bees swarmed around Tony Bonser while he refueled 33Z at the end of the day on the east side of the silo. There were bees flying around everywhere near the refueling pad. No one was stung, but others are advised that there are bees in the area.

## TOW ROPE SPLICE AT ENDS

In case you have not noticed, Don Burns has implemented a new technique for attaching the rings at each end of our tow ropes. This is in response to observations back in June during the 1-26 contest when the end of the rope started to pull out of the hollow center of the rope into which it was inserted. This technique of weaving strands of the rope as the end is inserted into the hollow sleeve internal to the rope has been completely successful in preventing any extraction of the end from the sleeve. As you are inspecting the rope prior to each launch you should expect to see this configation at both ends of all our tow ropes and adapter rope. It is the new normal.

The answers are not all that secret, but the desire is for candidates to at least put in some effort to gain the desired knowledge. One can go to the <u>Study Guide</u>, complete the practice tests and have them graded and the correct answers will be provided along with a specific reference.

## HELP FINDING SOMEONE TO SWAP CREW DAY ASSIGNMENTS

A web-based process for facilitating swapping crew day assignments was announced in the 2/21/2017 Frequent Flyer along with instructions for using the system. This process is intended to help members find another member who will agree to swap crew duties for one specific set of dates. It is not for getting reassigned to a different crew for an indefinite period. Mark Miller is now the person who oversees crew assignments, so Mark is the one to whom you need to speak about a long term change.

Remember that UOP 2.2 CREW MEMBER DUTIES states: "All crew members are to report for duty at 9:30 AM and work until released by the Crew Chief. Each crew member is personally responsible for arranging for a qualified substitute in case of his or her absence. Scheduled crew members are expected to be present for each of their scheduled crew days regardless of flying conditions." This new process does not relieve any crew member from the responsibility for arranging for a qualified substitute and informing the crew chief; rather it is intended to help accomplish that task. As of 5:00 pm on 9/18/2018 there are no requests for a member to swap or substitute a crew day.

## PUBLICATION OF FREQUENT FLYER TO BE INTERRUPTED
