OKTOBERFEST AND NEIGHBOR APPRECIATION DAY - MAURY DRUMMEY

Plan to join in the festivities on Saturday, October 20, as neighbors surrounding the CCSC property come and join us for a glider ride. If the weather cooperates Saturday could be a busy day because 11 airmen from WPAFB are also expected to come for Introductory Flights. So, come early and enjoy a flight to check out the foliage and then meet at the clubhouse about 5 PM for the CCSC version of Oktoberfest. Food and drinks will be provided by the club for a nominal charge (~\$5??). (Members are also asked to provide a dessert.)

SATURDAY, 29 SEPTEMBER - DICK HOLZWARTH

It was a gorgeous day for soaring. Earlier in the season there probably would have been a bigger turn out, but we enjoyed 17 flights (14 club member flights, 2 mile high guest rides, 1 regular guest ride) between 10:30 and 16:30. One highlight was returning N2615H (yellow 2-33) to service after a satisfactory test flight.

SUNDAY, 30 SEPTEMBER - DAVE MENCHEN

It was a great day for gliding, but a poor day for soaring; there was no lift anywhere all day. Nevertheless there were 24 flights including two guest rides.

WEDNESDAY, 3 OCTOBER - KEITH KILPATRICK

The day started out with low ceilings and did not start clearing until around 11am. Winds were from the southwest with gusts that increased as the afternoon progressed. Tow pilots were uncomfortable in these conditions so we shut down flight operations at 2pm having launched only six flights.

SATURDAY, 6 OCTOBER - STEVE FENSTERMAKER

Overcast at 11,000 feet, a layer of scattered clouds at 2,500 feet and surface winds at 8 kts from the south west limited the interest in flying but we still managed 14 flights overall, including one Mile High Introductory Flight.

SUNDAY, 7 OCTOBER - MICHAEL KARRAKER

The First Sunday Crew had a great day with a total of 41 flights of which 10 were guest rides and five of those came as a group, so we were busy. One member completed a Flight Review. Thanks to John Lubon, Bill Gabbard, Gorden Penner and Bob Miller for all their help. Only one student showed up for training crew and there were only two flights in private aircraft . . . where was everyone else?

SATURDAY, 13 OCTOBER - DICK HOLZWARTH

Operations were delayed until approximately 14:00 due to low ceilings, but once the clouds broke we managed 19 flights, including 6 guest rides.

SUNDAY, 14, OCTOBER - DAVE MENCHEN

Sunday dawned with low clouds and light rain, but as Shakespeare said, the show must go on.

The entire crew showed up, so we got some flights in to maintain currency. Fred Hawk got a couple of Grob 102 flights to check out the new gauge and reported that all is well. Eight flights total.

The answers are not all that secret, but the desire is for candidates to at least put in some effort to gain the desired knowledge. One can go to the Study Guide, complete the practice tests and have them graded and the correct answers will be provided along with a specific reference.

HELP FINDING SOMEONE TO SWAP CREW DAY ASSIGNMENTS

A web-based process for facilitating swapping crew day assignments was announced in the 2/21/2017 Frequent Flyer along with instructions for using the system. This process is intended to help members find another member who will agree to swap crew duties for one specific set of dates. It is not for getting reassigned to a different crew for an indefinite period. Mark Miller is now the person who oversees crew assignments, so Mark is the one to whom you need to speak about a long term change.

Remember that UOP 2.2 CREW MEMBER DUTIES states: "All crew members are to report for duty at 9:30 AM and work until released by the Crew Chief. Each crew member is personally responsible for arranging for a qualified substitute in case of his or her absence. Scheduled crew members are expected to be present for each of their scheduled crew days regardless of flying conditions." This new process does not relieve any crew member from the responsibility for arranging for a qualified substitute and informing the crew chief; rather it is intended to help accomplish that task. As of 6:00 pm on 10/16/2018 there are no requests for a member to swap or substitute a crew day.
