

It was a frigid morning (notice the ice in the water bottle).

Then the clouds rolled in.

The 2nd Sunday Crew had sunshine but it was chilly with wind at 7 kts from the S/SW. We operated from the east end and had 17 flights. The ground was soft on the south side, so we landed gliders in the middle and tow planes on the north side. We had three instructors thanks to help from Bob Miller, Tom McDonald and Larry Kirkbride but with only one tow pilot we were limited in flights. The big news is that Instructor Renewal Tests with Bob Miller were completed by both Manfred Maurer and Andy Swanson. CFI SCHOLARSHIP FROM SSA - TOM MCDONALD

The SSA is offering a new scholarship program to encourage members to become certified as flight instructors for gliders. This includes both initial and add-on instructor certificates and is good for a total of \$2000. That includes \$1500 from the national organization and a \$500 match from CCSC which the Board authorized at the most recent meeting.

There are 13 scholarships available. The application period opens on January 1st, and is first-come, first served. Effectively, that means that we should also consider January 1st as the deadline. We can only submit one application from our club.

The scholarships are intended to encourage the development of new club flight instructors. Our guidance from SSA is to select our nominee considering their likely effectiveness as teachers/instructors.

It is hoped that this program will provide an incentive to individuals who might otherwise not begin their CFI-G training, or are unlikely to complete their current CFI-G training, for financial reasons. It is also hoped that this program will provide an incentive to clubs to encourage their members to become flight instructors.

Interested? <u>Let me know</u>; don't wait for a call. I'll fill you in on the details. You will need to provide a brief soaring biography and explanation of what your motivation and goals are in becoming an instructor for CCSC.

I would like to have expressions of interest this month, and not be rushed on the deadline with the upcoming hilidays. This is an open process. In the case of multiple applicants, our board will ultimately decide on our nominee.

BRONZE BADGE QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

How many feet will a glider sink in 10 nautical miles if its lift/drag ratio is 23:1?

- a) 2,400 feet.
- b) 2,600 feet.
- c) 4,300 feet.

What would be a proper action or procedure to use if the pilot is getting too low on a cross-country flight in a sailplane?

- a) Continue on course until descending to 1,000 feet above the ground and then plan the landing approach.
- b) Fly directly into the wind and make a straight-in approach at the end of the glide.
- c) Have a suitable landing area selected before reaching 2,000 feet AGL, and a specific field chosen upon reaching 1,500 feet AGL.

What corrective action should be taken if, while thermalling at minimum sink speed in turbulent air, the left wing drops while turning to the left?

- a) Apply more opposite (right) aileron pressure than opposite (right) rudder pressure to counteract the over banking tendency.
- b) Apply opposite (right) rudder pressure to slow the rate of turn.
- c) Lower the nose before applying opposite (right) rudder and aileron pressure.

Approximately how many feet will a sailplane sink in 15 nautical miles if its lift/drag ratio is 22:1?

- a) 2,700 feet.
- b) 3,600 feet.
- c) 4,100 feet.

A cross-country profile view helps ensure safe return-or-proceed altitude by providing a series of:

- a) Decision points.
- b) Speeds to fly.
- c) Glide ratios.

There have been several inquiries about where to find the approved answers and the references in which Bronze Badge topics are explained and discussed. The answers are not all that secret, but the desire is for candidates to at least put in some effort to gain the desired knowledge. One can go to the Study Guide, complete the practice tests and have them graded and the correct answers will be provided along with a specific reference.

HELP FINDING SOMEONE TO SWAP CREW DAY ASSIGNMENTS

A web-based process for facilitating swapping crew day assignments was announced in the 2/21/2017 Frequent Flyer along with instructions for using the system. This process is intended to help members find another member who will agree to swap crew duties for one specific set of dates. It is not for getting reassigned to a different crew for an indefinite period. Mark Miller is now the person who oversees crew assignments, so Mark is the one to whom you need to speak about a long term change.

Remember that UOP 2.2 CREW MEMBER DUTIES states: "All crew members are to report for duty at 9:30 AM and work until released by the Crew Chief. Each crew member is personally responsible for arranging for a qualified substitute in case of his or her absence. Scheduled crew members are expected to be present for each of their scheduled crew days regardless of flying conditions." This new process does not relieve any crew member from the responsibility for arranging for a qualified substitute and informing the crew chief; rather it is intended to help accomplish that task. As of 7:00 pm on 11/13/2018 there is one request for a member to swap or substitute a crew day.
