When the Third Saturday Crew got to CCSC there was little expectation that we would fly because the solid overcast was low, but Don Green took a test flight in N8848L and offered that those who wanted to complete currency flights (a couple members were there for that purpose) could certainly take "pattern tows" and satisfy those requirements with the 1600 foot AGL ceiling and light/variable breezes. Away we went, flying from the west end of the field and using the north side of the runway because the south side was still rather soft in places.



Steve McManus was one of the first to complete a currency flight before taking his turn piloting 48L.



Before the sun came out it was chilly waiting for one flight at a time to see whether the tow plane would return sooner than the glider.



Charlie DeBerry was kept busy all day with instructor duties. Finally he got a chance to fly once himself and Don Green got Steve McManus to take over the controls of N8848L so that he could have his turn to fly with Charlie. Notice the sun starting to come out bright enough to cast shadows.



The day got better steadily such that we logged a total of 15 flights. By mid-afternoon the sun stayed out long enough to do some warming and the Grob-103 actually found a thermal over the field and managed to climb about 550 feet. Not great, but a thrill on a day that seemed most unlikely at the start.

CFI SCHOLARSHIP FROM SSA - TOM MCDONALD

The SSA is offering a new scholarship program to encourage members to become certified as flight instructors for gliders. This includes both initial and add-on instructor certificates and is good for a total of \$2000. That includes \$1500 from the national organization and a \$500 match from CCSC which the Board authorized at the most recent meeting.

There are 13 scholarships available. The application period opens on January 1st, and is first-come, first served. Effectively, that means that we should also consider January 1st as the deadline. We can only submit one application from our club.

The scholarships are intended to encourage the development of new club flight instructors. Our guidance from SSA is to select our nominee considering their likely effectiveness as teachers/instructors.

It is hoped that this program will provide an incentive to individuals who might otherwise not begin their CFI-G training, or are unlikely to complete their current CFI-G training, for financial reasons. It is also hoped that this program will provide an incentive to clubs to encourage their members to become flight instructors.

Interested? <u>Let me know</u>; don't wait for a call. I'll fill you in on the details. You will need to provide a brief soaring biography and explanation of what your motivation and goals are in becoming an instructor for CCSC.

I would like to have expressions of interest this month, and not be rushed on the deadline with the upcoming hilidays. This is an open process. In the case of multiple applicants, our board will ultimately decide on our nominee.

TURKEY SHOOT POSTPONED - STEVE STATKUS

The CCShotgunClub will hold the 2018 Turkey Shoot at an undisclosed location 7.2 miles from the glider club on November 28. If you're even slightly interested, bring your blunderbuss with you and we'll make some noise while having a good time at the remote shooting range. If you don't have a 12 or 20 gauge shotgun, don't worry, we'll provide you a loaner. We'll leave after soup and convoy for the 10-15 minute ride. BRONZE BADGE QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

A properly computed flight profile should allow the sailplane to arrive over either the departure or destination airport, or a safe landing place no less than:

- a) 500 feet AGL.
- b) 1,000 feet AGL.
- c) 1,500 feet AGL.

The proper speed to fly when passing through lift with no intention to stop and work lift is:

- a) Best L/D speed.
- b) Minimum Sink speed.
- c) Rough air red line.

After touch down on an off-field landing it is best to:

- a) Allow the glider to roll towards a nearby gate.
- b) Stop as soon as possible.
- c) Intentionally ground loop the glider.

Off-field landing patterns should be flown:

- a) Higher than normal.
- b) Faster than normal.
- c) The same as normal.

Generally speaking, while flying cross-country, you should always:

- a) Remain on course line to prevent being lost.
- b) Fly towards suitable landing areas when reaching 3,000 ft AGL.
- c) Be within gliding range of suitable landing areas with a generous margin of safety.

There have been several inquiries about where to find the approved answers and the references in which Bronze Badge topics are explained and discussed. The answers are not all that secret, but the desire is for candidates to at least put in some effort to gain the desired knowledge. One can go to the Study Guide, complete the practice tests and have them graded and the correct answers will be provided along with a specific reference.

HELP FINDING SOMEONE TO SWAP CREW DAY ASSIGNMENTS

A web-based process for facilitating swapping crew day assignments was announced in the 2/21/2017 Frequent Flyer along with instructions for using the system. This process is intended to help members find another member who will agree to swap crew duties for one specific set of dates. It is not for getting reassigned to a different crew for an indefinite period. Mark Miller is now the person who oversees crew assignments, so Mark is the one to whom you need to speak about a long term change.

Remember that UOP 2.2 CREW MEMBER DUTIES states: "All crew members are to report for duty at 9:30 AM and work until released by the Crew Chief. Each crew member is personally responsible for arranging for a qualified substitute in case of his or her absence. Scheduled crew members are expected to be present for each of their scheduled crew days regardless of flying conditions." This new process does not relieve any crew member from the responsibility for arranging for a qualified substitute and informing the crew chief; rather it is intended to help accomplish that task. As of 3:00 pm on 11/20/2018 there is one request for a member to swap or substitute a crew day.
