WINTER FLYING AT HOOK FIELD

The CCSC Board authorized preparations to be made for operations at Middletown Regional Airport Hook Field (MWO). Brian Stoops is finalizing the arrangements. Operations will start by 2/15, weather permitting. As in prior years there will be a surcharge (between \$5 and \$10) to cover the additional off site costs. There will be at least one K21 and one 2-33 at MWO. Further details will be provided in the Frequent Flyer when available. Cell phone numbers for crew chiefs are provided on the back page of the Frequent Flyer and on the Ground Crew page on the web site if you want to get confirmation about operations before leaving home. You can get there off of I-75 at the Middletown exit, follow the signs. Be sure to have your logbook handy to get your CFI-G endorsement for your annual currency check now required by the UOP.

FUEL INDEX REVISED TO \$0.32/100 FT

The fuel tank was recently filled, resulting in a small adjustment in the fuel charge to \$0.32 per 100 feet of altitude. During winter operations at Hook Field the tow planes may be burning 100 LL purchased at the field which will be more expensive. It is anticipated that cost will be recovered by a surcharge on operations off site as has been the case in past years. The details are still being worked out.

DREAMS AND GOALS by Dan Reagan

You may remember in November 2012, John Lubon started the idea of flying from Caesar Creek to Blairstown, NJ. Well, he is at it again!

Now he wants to start from Williamsport, Pennsylvania (north central PA) and head southwest. 
