WEDNESDAY CREW ENJOYS 13 FLIGHTS

The fuselage frame for 16Q was moved into the shop where Steve Statkus started reassembling the controls. He did not get as much help as on other Wednesdays, because attention was focused at the flight line. After enjoying the Ellen DeBerry's vegetable soup and evaluating it as "the best soup we ever had" the crew also enjoyed apple pie, all served by Charlie DeBerry. Then all gathered at the flight line. Don Green flew 48L for all 13 tows and Charlie DeBerry was kept busy all afternoon as members completed annual CCSC field flight checks. Keith Kilpatrick was also busy preparing for his upcoming Practical Test with Bob Miller.

WEEKEND CREWS MAKE MORE PROGRESS ON ANNUAL INSPECTIONS

Saturday was wet with low ceilings and Sunday the first snow for the season blanketed the field and winds were 20 MPH, so there was no flying either day. Dick Holzwarth's 2nd Saturday Crew started the annual inspection work on the Grob-103 fuselage. John Murray has completed the AD work on the wings and returned them to CCSC. The 2nd Saturday Crew also taped the wing roots, ailerons, etc. of the Grob-102. It is ready to return to service as soon as more tape is obtained with which to seal the horizontal stabilizer/elevator.



Back on December 12 the 2nd Saturday crew disassembled the Grob-103 and delivered the wings to John Murray for AD work. This Saturday the crew started preparing the fuselage for inspection.

The glider is back in the shop and we're installing the controls we removed earlier. The right wing is at Cubby's for reskinning the lower surface. The frame looks really good; if you havn't stopped by to take a look, you should.

So far we've spent about \$4140 getting to this point. We have all the materials we need to get it covered and ready for painting the fabric. We'll need to buy two gallons of poly brush color for the fuselage and four quarts for the tail and some fuselage details plus probably four gallons of enamel for the wings. That's gonna put us right at the \$5K budget the board allocated.

We've found another approach to the cockpit side panels so will be saving about \$1100 by making them locally. Dan Reagan has manufactured one set so far and they look really good. We'll need to

reimburse him for his materials. Dan is a superior craftsman and really saved the day on this one.

We've managed to make remarkable progress to date with the help of many club members and some good old fashion hard work and out of the box thinking when necessary. But the devil is in the details and we're at the point of meeting the devil on the reassembly. Patience is the watch word going forward.

It is planned to commence covering the frame with fabric this Wednesday, 1/13/16, once all the interior hardware is installed. If you're interested in learning the steps of covering using the Ceconite process and will be helping covering 16Q, you ought to plan to join us Wednesday. - Seve Statkus

COMPLETE YOUR ANNUAL CCSC FIELD FLIGHT CHECK

CCSC Uniform Operating Procedures (UOP) state: "In order to fly a CCSC glider as PIC each CCSC member (except for instructors) must receive a CCSC field flight review each calendar year in the highest performing CCSC aircraft in which he/she is qualified to fly consisting of at least one dual instructional flight with a CCSC instructor with logbook endorsement. Note: For the purpose of this review the G103 and ASK 21 are considered to be of equal performance." In other words the first flight of the year in a CCSC glider needs to be with an instructor. Be sure your instructor signs the flight card because that is how Noelle knows that you completed the requirement so she can give you credit on the "Approved to Fly List."

WHICH BADGE DO YOU PLAN TO EARN IN 2016?

Many of you who read the article last week about the "A" and "B" badges may have reacted "been there, done that" and some current students may also have realized that they are well on the way to earning those badges.

Great! This week let's look at the requirements for the "C Badge"

To earn the C Badge you must complete the following:

which is preparing pilots for cross country flight.

- Dual Soaring Practice, including instruction in techniques for soaring thermals, ridge soaring, and wave (simulated flight and/or ground instruction may be used when suitable conditions do not exist).
- Have knowledge of:
 - o Cross-country Procedures
 - o Sailplane Assembly, Disassembly, and Retrieves
 - Hazards of Cross-country Flying
- Demonstrate Soaring Ability by Solo Flight of at Least 60 Minutes Duration After Release From 2,000 Foot Tow (add 1½ minutes per 100 foot of tow above 2,000 feet).
- While Accompanied by an SSA Instructor, Demonstrate the Following:
 - o Make a Simulated Off-field Landing From an Approach Without Reference to the Altimeter
 - Perform an Accuracy Landing From the Approach, Touching Down and Coming to a Complete Stop Within an Area No Greater Than 500 Feet in Length.

As with the A and B badges, the knowledge and training requirements for the C Badge are included in the CCSC training program for the Private Pilot Certificate, so only the 60 minute solo flight (75 minutes if release is at 3000 AGL) is beyond the requirements for the Private Practical Test. Many students enjoy a solo flight in excess of an hour prior to taking the Practical Test, so the C Badge is also a reasonable goal for 2016 even if you are still preparing for the Private Practical Test.

TRACTOR FOR CUTTING GRASS

Provision was made in the budget for a tractor. No decisions have been made yet, but the Board will be discussing this topic at the February meeting. An estimate of \$5K has been obtained for repairing our big John Deere 3020, which has major hydraulic system problems and also a failed starter (by the end of the season the only way it could be started was to push it). Replacing it with a new or recent model tractor in good condition is under consideration. Henry Meyerrose has obtained initial pricing for a suitable tractor equipped with a bucket loader. If we trade in both the current tractors the price will be in the low \$30K range. Financing may be considered in keeping with the budget.



RIDGE SOARING TRIP 2016

Ready for a road trip? This coming April 24th through April 30th a hardy crew from CCSC will venture to Ridge Soaring in Julian, PA, in hopes of flying the Bald Eagle Ridge. Every year we tow our gliders and one of the Club's K-21s to the ridge. The K-21 is available for orientation flights for new adventurers and those that just want to fly the local area.

Tom Knauff and Doris Grove operate Ridge Soaring at the base of the Bald Eagle Ridge and have provided their clubhouse and hospitality for the CCSC visitors each spring for the past 40+ years. Tow fees are \$50 each but when the ridge is working that can mean hours in the air and distances over 750 km. Even when the winds are not providing ridge lift the thermals that come off of the gaps in the ridge will allow long flights and hours in the air.





Ridge Soaring Gliderport is at the base of Bald Eagle Ridge, a 500 mile long series of mountains beginning at Williamsport, PA, and curving its way to just north of Knoxville. TN.

CCSC has secured a block of 10 rooms at the Quality Inn in State College, PA, for that week at the reduced rate of \$79/night. This is higher than the deal we got last year, but rates have gone up significantly and this is still a \$20/night discount. The Quality Inn is located on N. Atherton just 20 minutes over the ridge from Julian. Each room has a refrigerator and breakfast is served daily. There is plenty of shopping and

there are restaurants available. Just call the Quality Inn at (814) 234-1600 and tell them that you are with Caesar Creek Soaring Club (our group number is 2402888) to reserve your room for as many nights as you think you can participate.
