

FOURTH SUNDAY CREW REPORT - STEVE STATKUS

It was a beautiful day. Field was dry everywhere which is amazing since we had 3-4 inches of rain on Friday. We only got 1 flight in due to high winds: On the Bueaford Scale winds were Force 5 or 6 (0-12) which is one or two steps below a gale. On the Lubon Sporty Scale (0-10) winds were an 8. The wind sock looked engorged and was generally down the runway but swung 45 degrees either side occasionally. At noon we called it quits from a safety standpoint. We debugged the leading edges of 48L and washed 33Z. Tim finished the oil change on 909. Dick Scheper had no luck fishing the pond.

HELP FINDING SOMEONE TO SWAP CREW DAY ASSIGNMENTS

A web-based process for facilitating swapping crew day assignments was announced in the 2/21/2017 Frequent Flyer along with instructions for using the system. This process is intended to help members find another member who will agree to swap crew duties for one specific set of dates. It is **not** for getting reassigned to a different crew for an indefinite period. Brian Stoops is the person who oversees crew assignments, so Brian is the one to whom you need to speak about a long term change.

Remember that **UOP 2.2 CREW MEMBER DUTIES** states: "All crew members are to report for duty at 9:30 AM and work until released by the Crew Chief. Each crew member is personally responsible for arranging for a qualified substitute in case of his or her absence. Scheduled crew members are expected to be present for each of their scheduled crew days regardless of flying conditions." This new process does not relieve any crew member of the responsibility for arranging for a qualified substitute and informing the crew chief; rather it is intended to help accomplish that task.

As of 2:00 pm on 6/27/2017 there are two requests for a member to swap or substitute a crew day.

Instead, readers will be reminded that full contact information about each member is available in the Membership Roster accessible from the Members Only page on the website as on the last page Crew list.

As we move forward with avoiding putting email addresses or phone numbers in the Frequent Flyer it becomes important that you verify that the information about you in the <u>Membership Roster</u> is current and accurate.
