CONGRATULATIONNS DANIEL KATUZIENSKI - PRIVATE PILOT-GLIDER

On Thursday, June 7, Daniel Katuzienski completed his Practical Test for the Private Pilot-Glider Certificate with Bob Miller.



Dieter Schmidt piloted the tow plane for Daniel's Practical Test on a very smooth day with almost no thermal activity.



Daniel moved to the Dayton area in August of 2017 and lost no time joining CCSC. He previously had experience in powered airplanes and was a member of Blue Ridge Soaring Society in New Castle, VA, where he had already completed his first solo in a glider. From his first contact with CCSC members Daniel expressed the goal of completing his glider rating add-on while stationed at WPAFB. We congratulate Daniel on this achievement.

SATURDAY REPORT - DICK HOLZWARTH

The Second Saturday crew took advantage of the weather while it lasted and launched a total of 23 flights, including nine guest rides, six of which were airmen from WPAFB participating in the outdoor recreation program. Operations were terminated about 17:00 due to building thunder storms in vicinity. By 18:03 it was raining hard.

Uncertainty about the weather kept a lot of folks at home, but we still got thirteen flights completed before the rain started.

1-26 CHAMPIONSHIP CONTEST - A ROUGH ROLL UP - STEVE STATKUS

Preparations began months ago. Our annual spring clean up was the kick off effort beginning with two days of volunteer labor by about 30 club members organized by Keith Kilpatrick. The effort continued right up to May 18 when contestants started arriving. Our field looked great thanks to the spring rains and mowing by volunteers Jonny, Henry and Dan Reagan. Jim Gobel did his buzz cut thing and our club initials were visible from the ISS. (Don't believe him when he tells you he has a GPS app for his mower.)

Our tow planes were all full up and serviceable and ready for the task of 2K AGL light weight tows (and aero retrieves) for the next ten days. They performed wonderfully, consuming about 300 gallons of 100 octane low lead avgas. Tim Christman rounded up all the volunteer (12) tow pilots we needed. They launched about 130 flights during the contest.

We had two launch crews of 3 people each managed by Mark Miller. For the most part these guys were volunteer senior citizens who had never run tow ropes for a contest. I'm happy to report we did not have a single cardiac event during the contest. We launched 20-22 gliders in about 45 minutes for 5 days and at the end of the launch these runners were sweaty and winded. I'm thinking we did a good thing upgrading their cardiovascular fitness, but I'm not too sure I'd want to do it again in 4 years with these same guys. (I think we pushed the envelope this year and dodged a bullet.) A large thank you goes to Don Burns for making six new 1-26 tow ropes. They'll be stored in the office until we host the Championship again in 2022.

Catered meals were big events at our contest and Lucy Anne and Mike started off the effort by grilling brats and burgers on Tuesday 5/22. We had planned on accommodating 45 folks for the meals and this number held pretty good until the last day when we ordered pizza (too many Italians in the contest.) For the contest, we had planned five catered events, which adds up to 225 meals. Lucy Anne's team of volunteers always covered the event. We sold about 300 cans of \$1.00 beer.

Chuck Lohre served as our daily reporter and did a fine job interviewing all pilots and support crew while being our token low performance/vintage glider in the meet. He finish mid pack but enjoyed some of the best soaring flights he's had at CCSC. I encouraged him to install nav lights and a landing light on his bird as he was using official sunset as his cut off time.

Our retrieve desk staffed by Norm Leet, Bill Hall and Lynn Alexander was kept busy throughout the contest. We averaged 4 trailer retrieves and two aero retrieves each contest day except day 5 when we had seven trailer and two aero retrieves. Just an FYI, the 1-26 Association requires a task to be a minimum of 30 miles in length. The 1-26 has a glide ratio of 23/1. Team CCSC landed out twice and received zero distance points for the other three days. We placed 18th out of 20. Not too shabby I'd say.

And CCSC made some money in the process; also not too shabby. It was an ALL VOLUNTEER EFFORT.

For those who might question the reason for a club to host a glider meet I'd suggest that you volunteer for one of the many jobs needed to make the event happen. You'll be treated to a catered meal and you can sit with the pilots and retrieve crews and feel the energy and companionship. You might learn a thing or two that could improve your soaring.

HELP FINDING SOMEONE TO SWAP CREW DAY ASSIGNMENTS

A web-based process for facilitating swapping crew day assignments was announced in the 2/21/2017 Frequent Flyer along with instructions for using the system. This process is intended to help members find another member who will agree to swap crew duties for one specific set of dates. It is not for getting reassigned to a different crew for an indefinite period. Mark Miller is now the person who oversees crew assignments, so Mark is the one to whom you need to speak about a long term change.

Remember that UOP 2.2 CREW MEMBER DUTIES states: "All crew members are to report for duty at 9:30 AM and work until released by the Crew Chief. Each crew member is personally responsible for arranging for a qualified substitute in case of his or her absence. Scheduled crew members are expected to be present for each of their scheduled crew days regardless of flying conditions." This new process does not relieve any crew member from the responsibility for arranging for a qualified substitute and informing the crew chief; rather it is intended to help accomplish that task. As of 1:00 pm on 6/12/2018 there are five requests for a member to swap or substitute a crew day.
