CONGRATULATIONS CHRISTIAN SUMMERS: B-BADGE - RICH CARRAWAY



It was only his 5th solo flight, but Chris Summers took good advantage of the wonderful soaring conditions on Wednesday. After launching from CCSC Chris released at 3940' MSL over Caesar Creek Lake. He managed to climb to 6000 MSL and flew as far as Lebanon and the South end of the Jeremiah Bridge, extending his flight for 1 hour and 45 minutes. In Christian's words: "I would not have come back so soon, but I had to use the restroom." This flight is well in excess of the requirements for the SSA B-Badge: "a solo flight of at least 30 minutes duration after release from a 2,000-foot tow (add 11/2 minutes per 100 foot tow altitude above 2,000 feet)." Jim Goebel has already completed the paperwork for Christian to receive his "B" badge. Quite an achievement for a young student pilot with limited experience! - Rich

CCSC TEAM IN 10TH PLACE IN OLC USA GOLD LEAGUE AT END OF ROUND 15

Despite the improved soaring weather in Ohio this past week the CCSC team ended up in 12th place for the week out of the 16 teams submitting scoreable flights in the USA Gold OLC competition. This put our team in 10th place overall at the end of round 15 out of the 18 teams in USA Gold. When all the raw data tabulated above were processed by the <u>Gold League scoring rules</u> (aircraft handicap, course rules, top three only, etc.) these are the only three flights which were counted for Round 15.

HELP FINDING SOMEONE TO SWAP CREW DAY ASSIGNMENTS

A web-based process for facilitating swapping crew day assignments was announced in the 2/21/2017 Frequent Flyer along with instructions for using the system. This process is intended to help members find another member who will agree to swap crew duties for one specific set of dates. It is not for getting reassigned to a different crew for an indefinite period. Mark Miller is now the person who oversees crew assignments, so Mark is the one to whom you need to speak about a long-term change.

Remember that UOP 2.2 CREW MEMBER DUTIES states: "All crew members are to report for duty at 9:30 AM and work until released by the Crew Chief. Each crew member is personally responsible for arranging for a qualified substitute in case of his or her absence. Scheduled crew members are expected to be present for each of their scheduled crew days regardless of flying conditions." This new process does not relieve any crew member from the responsibility for arranging for a qualified substitute and informing the crew chief; rather it is intended to help accomplish that task. As of 1:00 pm on 7/30/2019 there is one request for a member to swap or substitute a crew day.
