- A very changeable day at the glider port...
- Drove up under an overcast sky but arrived to a beautiful blue sky. I took the first flight of the day and actually found lift to work with.
- Within an hour we had solid overcast and 1500 foot ceilings.
- The overcast stayed but the ceilings rose to over 3000 feet.
- No sun and a light breeze mad for a cold flight line, but we still managed 15 flights, including a BFR for Andy Swanson!
- Same issues as others have reported
- with the gas pump, the volume gage is almost worthless, and the hose leaks at the metal connector.
- Flew 48L, seems to have a periodic contact with the starter pinion and the flywheel when running, with nicks visible on the back side of the flywheel. Tach time was 3885.5.
- As Clement Clarke Moor would say, Happy Christmas to all and to all a good night.

2nd SATURDAY DEC 12 CREW REPORRT - Dick Holzwarth

- There were no crew operations due to inclement weather. Hence, no issues to report.
- In addition to the rain actually falling at 10:00, the forecast called for continued rain into the early afternoon, with decreasing ceilings and increasing winds from the south. Just not a good day to be in a glider.
