- --Take the **<u>quiz</u>** on the make & model glider's <u>Performance & Limitations</u>.
- -- Fly smart. Fly safe.
- 2. CCSC Academics for self-study has transitioned to the Holtz Flight Training for Gliders.
 - -- End-of-Chapter tests are available in the testing binders (answer sheets separate)
- -- Knauf tests will not be accepted after the third Sunday in February (Feb 21)
- -- Study and test accordingly
- -- Yellow books are being replaced to reflect the new Holtz flight training program.
- -- Holtz texts are available for purchase in the clubhouse

NEW GLIDER DISCUSSED AT JAN BOARD MEETING – John Lubon

John Lubon reported on a suggestion from John Murray that we plan for a new two place. The Grob 103 is coming up on its 6,000 hour inspection, about \$10,000. A new K21 is about \$130,000. A new Duo Discus is about \$150,000. A new ASK 21 would have more room for taller pilots in the back seat and comes with a spin kit. John Murray suggested we put away some funds and borrow the rest. Pay for it over five years. We could get about \$30,000 for our Grob 103. We may plan to save \$100,000 over five years, if 200 members contribute \$10 per month specifically for new glider. Bob Miller mentioned that instructors need to do spin recovery before check ride but it's not required. John Lubon will write up the proposal to the members and publish in the newsletter.

• John Lubon and Dan Reagan cleaned up a few trees that had blown down




4th SATURDAY DEC 26 CREW REPORRT – Chuck Lohre

SSA INSTRUCTOR GRANT APPLICATIONS DUE BY APR 1

• At the January board meeting Chuck Lohre reported on the research he had done on the SSA instructors' grant for \$1,500 that Bob Miller brought up at the December meeting. He's going to apply and this announcement is to alert anyone else who wants to apply. Here's the web site link https://www.ssa.org/GrowthDevelopment?show=blog&id=6232

• From the announcement, "The SSA is pleased to announce the continuation of the scholarship program for new CFI-Gs. This successful program was begun in 2019 with generous donations from John Weber and others. It is being continued with additional funding from donors, and also directly from the SSA. The goal is to grow the sport through stronger clubs with enthusiastic flight instruction and training programs. The SSA hopes the scholarships will provide an incentive to individuals who might otherwise not begin their CFI-G training, or are unlikely to complete their current CFI-G training for financial reasons. Interested SSA Chapters are encouraged to submit applicants who are likely to become active and effective instructors in their club."

BRONZE BADGE QUESTIONS
