3rd SATURDAY MAR 20 CREW REPORT – Rolf Hegele

• It was a nice day at the Gliderport. We had blue skies with very little wind. We totaled 23 flights including a Flight Review and a number of Field Checks. Chris Uhl came down from that land up north and after his currency flights, he was kept busy instructing along with Kat McManus. Thanks to Larry Kirkbride for helping out with instruction. We used triple 2s today. Two towplanes, two k-21s, and two 2-33s.

• Everything went well until the last two flights in the Pickle. It seems under the right circumstances the latch on the left rear window is loose enough to allow it to open in flight. The aircraft has been red-tagged as the foam filling the gaps has ripped and torn and we had a report that the elevator control was unusual in flight. It will all be checked and corrected as needed.

• We also had a report that the gas pump is not recording the gallons used. The numbers are not turning and even a reset does not let the gallons add up. So, we don't have an accurate account of how many gallons were being used. Someone needs to look at the pump.

• The tach time on 33Z is 7512.72 and 48L was not recorded.

• Hello, today was a beautiful day with lite lift and soarable conditions. 17 flights for the day. Thanks to Larry Kirkbride, Jim Goebel, and Bill Gabbard for helping us out. The pickle is red-tagged for 2 issues. The back window opens up in flight and the controls in pitch feel like something is hanging up. This does not happen during the pre-flight check but in flight. The fuel pump's counter is broken. Tow plane 48L's primer is broken. The freezer needs to be defrosted as there are several bags of ice frozen to the bottom and unusable.

BRONZE BADGE QUESTIONS

What is the cause of Valley Breeze (adiabatic) winds?

A Cooling air becomes more dense and therefore sinks. At night this sinking air will flow down hills and through valleys creating the wind.

B Warm air becomes less dense and rises. With the sun on a slope during the day, warm air flows up hill creating the wind.

C The wind blowing over a ridge creates a low pressure on the leeward slope, which in turn sucks air out of the leeward valley creating the wind.

What is an important airspeed limitation that is not color coded on airspeed indicators?

- A Never-exceed speed.
- B Maximum structural cruising speed.
- C Maneuvering speed.
- 122 The pitot system provides impact pressure for which instrument?
