Operations – COVID and Columbus Approach notes – Mark Miller

Although the infection rate for Warren County is down and lower than the average for Ohio, we will still require masks on the flight line and no guest rides. This is being evaluated each month by the BOD and hopefully, we can lift the restrictions in another month or two.

Meanwhile, we recognize that many of the members have been vaccinated. At the crew chief's discretion, he could allow no masks on the flight line, if everyone has been vaccinated. If there are one or two that have not been vaccinated, then the normal rule of wearing masks would apply. In addition, those people who have been vaccinated or are living within each other's personal bubble can take their masks off when flying together. Please wait until the canopy is closed and this is purely an individual decision.

One other item is contacting Columbus Approach when beginning ops for the day. There are two ways to do this: the crew chief calls them at 614-338-4092 or the tow pilot on his first check flight contact them on 118.85. They will ask about how long you intend to operate and about what altitudes you will be doing most of the flying.

New pilot at CCSC. Congrats!






300km RIDGE FLIGHT - Chuck Lohre

PASSENGER BRIEFING - Tom McDonald

Our commercial pilots are (or were, pre-COVID) used to giving passenger briefings to our guest riders. Private pilots taking a friend or relative for a flight may not be as familiar with what is required.

Think of what they tell you on an airline flight: seat belt use and how the doors work. The glider passenger briefing is the same, minus the formality. Make sure the passenger knows how to release the seatbelt once they strapped in, how the canopy works and how to get out of the aircraft. You'll probably talk about flight controls, what to expect during the flight and how to read the instruments, but that part is optional as far as the FAA is concerned. The FAR references are 91.107 and 91.519.

Lack of a good briefing with respect to canopies can cause things to go sideways. I flew AH-1 Cobra helicopters in the early 80's. One of our IP's gave a ride to visiting British general. After landing, he told our VIP to just lift up on the handle to his left to open the canopy, and that it might stick so use some force. The Brit gave the collective lever a healthy pull, unexpectedly putting them back in the air. Mr.Toad's Wild Ride and a massive overtourque resulted. Only blind luck avoided a crash.

LAND'S END EMBROIDERED CLOTHING AND PROMOTIONAL ITEMS AVAILABLE ONLINE – Chuck Lohre

At the April board meeting we approved the Land's End embroidered CCSC patch for use on their clothing line website. Go to http://business.landsend.com/store/ccsc select your garment or promotional product and then select the "APPLY LOGO(S)" box. I created the CCSC Patch for general club use. For my own personal use, I created the embroidery of my call sign "6V" and the ASW 15 planeform for the sleeves. If you would like your call sign or planeform created, send me a photo of your tail, the one-time cost is \$29 each to create the embroidery programming. Most of our planeforms are on the back of our silk screened t-shirts in the club house. The sizes run large, I got my usual XL shirt and it's too large for me. Only some of the promotional items are available one at a time for embroidery. My shirt, shown, cost \$35.95, plus \$8.95 for the patch and \$6.95 each for the sleeves. They will also charge you tax and my shipping was \$9.95.
