LAND UPDATE

Maury Drummey got a call from the selling realtor, Comey & Shepers Realtors, and forwarded it on to the Board. It turns out that the people who purchased the entire farm are now selling off parcels that are primarily the agricultural segments of the land. As can be seen from the attached picture, they have broken up the parcel on the north side of Gard Rd into three pieces.

There are two 20 acre sites along Elbon Rd and unfortunately, the one running along the corner of Elbon and Gard Roads has already been sold. We have been told that the new owners are not willing to come off that corner lot as they want to build a house close to the woods and use their land for a horse farm. That leaves for our consideration only the 20.01 acres lot. I asked if the owner would consider reducing the size of that lot to minimize the amount of woods included. He indicated that the owner might be persuaded to do something, but certainly nothing below 18 acres. There also might be a price tradeoff. Let the Board know your thoughts.

He said to make an offer and he would take it forward for consideration.

CREW CHIEF REPORTS

4TH SATURDAY REPORT

Ops started 10am and we had 9 flights including 1 mile high guest ride. Jim Gobel pitched-in with some early tow plane flying in support of the crew. We completed 1 BFR, 1 yearly field check, and three take off and landing series. SD and 135 were the only ships used for the day. Operations were to the west with wind picking up from SSW to about 12 mph sustained and some gusts. Landings were done on a diagonal from Northeast to Southwest to better land into the wind.

All golf carts used ran fine. They very much like the warmer weather. Wind was breaking any thermals up making for mostly glider (sled) rides. Jonny was cutting grass and rolling the field as rain had prevented doing this earlier in the week. Ops concluded about 4pm as thewind was picking up even more and no one else wanted to fly.

New ICOM handheld radio is in



crew locker in main hanger. It has a LiPo battery that can remain on charge full time (has under volt and over charge protection built in). If in doubt to change frequency, press the CLR button once at the upper right of keypad to get into "regular mode" and freq can just be punched in using all 6 digits. User manual to be posted to website member section this week.

Kubota is running OK. Checked oil and was OK. Fuel was low. Note that oil should be checked before starting as part of normal routine. One has to flip open the rear bin via the 2 latches by the seat. The oil stick is about at the middle of the motor. Same for oil checks with the golf carts before they are started.

The Grob-103 front canopy looks to have been "slammed" open tweaking the frame and bending the metal rail connector tabs. The canopy clearly does not fit smoothly at the front (left side low, right is high). John Murray may attempt to straighten but there is a danger that the canopy will crack. It just goes to show that small inattentions can lead to yet another multi thousand dollar repair bill for the club. Always place the canopies down (and locked) when not around the ships. Make sure they are supported if open when towplanes are operating around them. And make sure towplanes/pilots are not starting up or blowing prop wash directly at the sailplanes.

4TH SUNDAY REPORT

No flight operations due to high winds from the south. The crew picked up sticks and cleaned up the camp ground area. See picture below.

Equipment issues: 48L primer is not working. Golf cart #6 had a flat tire (right front) in the morning; air was added, but the tire was soft again at the end of the day. The left front tire on the Kubota was also soft at the end of the day and air was added.

2ND SATURDAY REPORT

No flights due to crappy weather conditions in the morning. We helped with the Club cleanup efforts.

3RD SUNDAY REPORT

Nice, but chilly day. Winds ENE 5 to 10 with some higher gusts. It was soarable, with young Michael showing it could be done. We had 19 flights total.

Embroidered patches are available in the display case at \$5 each. The design is slightly different from the Land's End version.

The Land's End embroidered CCSC patch is approved for use on their clothing line website. Go to

http://business.landsend.com/store/ccsc, select your garment or promotional product and then select the "APPLY LOGO(S)" box. The CCSC Patch was created for general club use. For my own personal use, I created the embroidery of my call sign "6V" and the ASW 15 planeform for the sleeves. If you would like your call sign or planeform created, send me a photo of your tail, the



one-time cost is \$29 each to create the embroidery programming. Most of our plane forms are on the back of our silk-screened t-shirts in the clubhouse. The sizes runlarge, I got my usual XL shirt and it's too large for me. Only some of the promotional items are available one at a time for embroidery. My shirt, shown, cost \$35.95, plus \$8.95 for the patch and \$6.95 each for the sleeves. They will also charge you tax and my shipping was \$9.95.
