## **CREW CHIEF REPORTS**

#### **2ND SATURDAY REPORT**

Routine operations from 27, using the full field. First flight off approximately 10:00, last flight just before 18:00 There was weather building around the gliderport for most of the afternoon, but rain showers passed north and south of us and we continued to operate throughout the day. Had two intro flights, both mile high. (James Nutter and Jennifer Tinch).

SGS 2-33 135 was returned from Cubby's and is in service. After approximately 3-4 flights, there were no reported issues. No issues or problems reported with any glider or towplane.

Ground equipment: The windscreen failed and fell out of Golf cart 6 during a retrieve. The mount bracket failed. The windscreen is propped up against the side of the barn in the golf cart storage area; the failed bracket is with it. Other than that, no issues with ground equipment.

#### 3<sup>RD</sup> SUNDAY REPORT

Light westerly winds and a beautiful clear day equaled a great day for training and a bit harder conditions for soaring. But we had 30 flights.

SD has several issues: 1. Red tagged for missing safety pin securing the elevator castle nut; 2. Back seat vent window broken off. Unable to find missing piece (It was near the stick in the back seat per Lucy Anne); 3. A metal piece was found in the baggage area that most likely supports a bag for storage. It is in the back of the trailer, in the plastic bin on the left. (it is the support for the storage bag in the back seat).

The left side of the headset for 909 isn't working. We had one retrieve from Fayette airport.

#### **3RD SATURDAY REPORT**

Low clouds and a threat for thunderstorms kept things shut down. We thought about pulling several aircraft out of the hanger, but the decided to do a survey of those that wanted to fly. Zero. Left everything in the hanger with no issues.

For my own personal use, I created the embroidery of my call sign "6V" and the ASW 15 planeform for the sleeves. If you would like your call sign or planeform created, send me aphoto of your tail, the



one-time cost is \$29 each to create the embroidery programming. Most of our plane forms are on the back of our silk-screened t-shirts in the clubhouse. The sizes runlarge, I got my usual XL shirt and it's too large for me. Only some of the promotional items are available one at a time for embroidery.
