PREPAID BABY GROB - ANDREW DIGNAN (PLANE CAPTAIN)

It is that time of year for putting out the annual notice for private pilots at CCSC to join in the Grob-102 Prepaid Group aka BG Fliers. For the cost of a \$100 up front payment, you get the following until the end of the year. No flight charges for the ship for the current year. Two hours of continuous flight time no matter what the sign-up list has on it (i.e. once you are in the ship it is yours unconditionally for up to two hours). Assembled single place sailplane ready to go. And finally, the knowledge of helping the club keep a single place glass glider in the fleet and available to all qualified private pilots.

What will not happen to you when you are flying BG as part of the Prepaid Group. The crew should not grumble about having to bring out the ship for you. The Crew Chief cannot call you back within that two hour flight window short of some bad weather or a closing of the flight line, i.e. safety reasons. Your name will be posted on a list on the trailer door as having these group privileges with BG. Should there be any questions, though it may be prudent to tell the chief before launching that you are a prepaid member and maybe up for up to two hours (let's hope!).

Embroidered patches are available in the display case at \$5 each. The design is slightly different from the Land's End version.

The Land's End embroidered CCSC patch is approved for use on their clothing line website. Go to http://business.landsend.com/store/ccsc, select your garment or promotional product and then select the "APPLY LOGO(S)" box. The CCSC Patch was created for general club use. For my own personal

use, I created the embroidery of my call sign "6V" and the ASW 15 planeform for the sleeves. If you would like your call sign or planeform created, send me a photo of your tail, the one-time cost is \$29 each to create the embroidery programming. Most of our plane forms are on the back of our silk-screened t-shirts in the clubhouse. The sizes runlarge, I got my usual XL shirt and it's too large for me. Only some of the promotional items are available one at a time for embroidery. My shirt, shown, cost \$35.95, plus \$8.95 for the patch and \$6.95 each for



the sleeves. They will also charge you tax and my shipping was \$9.95.
